AN ACT

To amend the Microenterprise for Self-Reliance Act of 2000 and the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 to increase assistance for the poorest people in developing countries under microenterprise assistance programs under those Acts, and for other purposes.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. AMENDMENTS TO THE MICROENTERPRISE FOR
4	SELF-RELIANCE ACT OF 2000.
5	(a) Purposes.—Section 103 of the Microenterprise
6	for Self-Reliance Act of 2000 (Public Law 106–309) is
7	amended—
8	(1) in paragraph (3) , by striking "microentre-
9	preneurs" and inserting "microenterprise house-
10	holds'';
11	(2) in paragraph (4), by striking "and" at the
12	end;
13	(3) in paragraph (5) —
14	(A) by striking "microfinance policy" and
15	inserting "microenterprise policy";
16	(B) by striking "the poorest of the poor"
17	and inserting "the very poor"; and
18	(C) by striking the period at the end and
19	inserting "; and"; and
20	(4) by adding at the end the following:
21	"(6) to ensure that in the implementation of
22	this title at least 50 percent of all microenterprise
23	assistance under this title, and the amendments
24	made under this title, shall be targeted to the very
25	poor.".

1	(b) DEFINITIONS.—Section 104 of such Act is
2	amended—
3	(1) in paragraph (2) , by striking "for micro-
4	entrepreneurs" and inserting "to microentrepreneurs
5	and their households"; and
6	(2) by adding at the end the following:
7	"(5) VERY POOR.—The term 'very poor' means
8	individuals—
9	"(A) living in the bottom 50 percent below
10	the poverty line established by the national gov-
11	ernment of the country in which those individ-
12	uals live; or
13	"(B) living on the equivalent of less than
14	\$1 per day.".
15	SEC. 2. AMENDMENTS TO THE MICRO- AND SMALL ENTER-
16	PRISE DEVELOPMENT CREDITS PROGRAM
17	UNDER THE FOREIGN ASSISTANCE ACT OF
18	1961.
19	(a) FINDINGS AND POLICY.—Section $108(a)(2)$ of
20	the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C.
21	2151f(a)(2)) is amended by striking "the development of
22	the enterprises of the poor" and inserting "the access to
23	financial services and the development of microenter-
24	prises".

(b) PROGRAM.—Section 108(b) of such Act (22
 U.S.C. 2151f(b)) is amended to read as follows:

3 "(b) PROGRAM.—To carry out the policy set forth in
4 subsection (a), the President is authorized to provide as5 sistance to increase the availability of financial services to
6 microenterprise households lacking full access to credit,
7 including through—

8 "(1) loans and guarantees to microfinance insti-9 tutions for the purpose of expanding the availability 10 of savings and credit to poor and low-income house-11 holds;

12 "(2) training programs for microfinance institu13 tions in order to enable them to better meet the fi14 nancial services needs of their clients; and

"(3) training programs for clients in order to
enable them to make better use of credit, increase
their financial literacy, and to better manage their
enterprises to improve their quality of life.".

19 (c) ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA.—Section 108(c) of such
20 Act (22 U.S.C. 2151f(c)) is amended—

21 (1) in the first sentence of the matter preceding
22 paragraph (1)—

23 (A) by striking "credit institutions" and
24 inserting "microfinance institutions"; and

(B) by striking "micro- and small enter prises" and inserting "microenterprise house holds"; and

4 (2) in paragraphs (1) and (2), by striking
5 "credit" each place it appears and inserting "finan6 cial services".

7 (d) ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENT.—Section 108(d) of
8 such Act (22 U.S.C. 2151f(d)) is amended by striking
9 "micro- and small enterprise programs" and inserting
10 "programs for microenterprise households".

(e) AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS.—Section 108(f)(1) of
such Act (22 U.S.C. 2151f(f)(1)) is amended by striking
"for each of fiscal years 2001 and 2002" and inserting
"for each of fiscal years 2001 through 2004".

(f) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—Section 108 of such
Act (22 U.S.C. 2151f) is amended in the heading to read
as follows:

18 "SEC. 108. MICROENTERPRISE DEVELOPMENT CREDITS.".

19 SEC. 3. AMENDMENTS TO THE MICROENTERPRISE DEVEL-

20OPMENT GRANT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM21UNDER THE FOREIGN ASSISTANCE ACT OF221961.

(a) FINDINGS AND POLICY.—Section 131(a) of the
Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2152a(a)) is
amended to read as follows:

"(a) FINDINGS AND POLICY.—Congress finds and de clares that—

"(1) access to financial services and the development of microenterprise are vital factors in the
stable growth of developing countries and in the development of free, open, and equitable international
economic systems;

8 "(2) it is therefore in the best interest of the 9 United States to facilitate access to financial serv-10 ices and assist the development of microenterprise in 11 developing countries;

12 "(3) access to financial services and the devel-13 opment of microenterprises can be supported by pro-14 grams providing credit, savings, training, technical 15 assistance, business development services, and other 16 financial and non-financial services; and

17 "(4) given the relatively high percentage of pop-18 ulations living in rural areas of developing countries, 19 and the combined high incidence of poverty in rural 20 areas and growing income inequality between rural 21 urban markets. microenterprise and programs 22 should target both rural and urban poor.".

23 (b) AUTHORIZATION.—Section 131(b) of such Act
24 (22 U.S.C. 2152a(b)) is amended—

1	(1) in paragraph (3)(A)(i), by striking "entre-
2	preneurs" and inserting "clients"; and
3	(2) in paragraph $(4)(D)$ —
4	(A) in clause (i), by striking "very small
5	loans" and inserting "financial services to poor
6	entrepreneurs"; and
7	(B) in clause (ii), by striking "micro-
8	finance" and inserting "microenterprise".
9	(c) Monitoring System.—Section 131(c) of such
10	Act (22 U.S.C. 2152a(c)) is amended by striking para-
11	graph (4) and inserting the following:
12	"(4) adopts the widespread use of proven and
13	effective poverty assessment tools to successfully
14	identify the very poor and ensure that they receive
15	needed microenterprise loans, savings, and assist-
16	ance.".
17	(d) Development and Application of Poverty
18	MEASUREMENT METHODS.—Section 131 of such Act (22
19	U.S.C. 2152a) is amended—
20	(1) by redesignating subsections (d) and (e) as
21	subsections (e) and (f), respectively; and
22	(2) by inserting after subsection (c) the fol-
23	lowing:

"(d) DEVELOPMENT AND CERTIFICATION OF POV ERTY MEASUREMENT METHODS; APPLICATION OF METH ODS.—

"(1) DEVELOPMENT AND CERTIFICATION.—(A) 4 5 The Administrator of the United States Agency for 6 International Development, in consultation with 7 microenterprise institutions and other appropriate 8 organizations, shall develop no fewer than two low-9 cost methods for partner institutions to use to assess 10 the poverty levels of their current or prospective cli-11 ents. The United States Agency for International 12 Development shall develop poverty indicators that 13 correlate with the circumstances of the very poor.

"(B) The Administrator shall field-test the
methods developed under subparagraph (A). As part
of the testing, institutions and programs may use
the methods on a voluntary basis to demonstrate
their ability to reach the very poor.

"(C) Not later than October 1, 2004, the Administrator shall, from among the low-cost poverty
measurement methods developed under subparagraph (A), certify no fewer than two such methods
as approved methods for measuring the poverty levels of current or prospective clients of microenter-

prise institutions for purposes of assistance under
 this section.

"(2) APPLICATION.—The Administrator shall 3 4 require that, with reasonable exceptions, all organi-5 applying for microenterprise zations assistance 6 under this Act use one of the certified methods, be-7 ginning no later than October 1, 2005, to determine 8 and report the poverty levels of current or prospec-9 tive clients.".

10 (e) LEVEL OF ASSISTANCE.—Section 131(e) of such 11 Act, as redesignated by subsection (d), is amended by in-12 serting "and \$175,000,000 for fiscal year 2003 and 13 \$200,000,000 for fiscal year 2004" after "fiscal years 14 2001 and 2002".

(f) DEFINITIONS.—Section 131(f) of such Act, as redesignated by subsection (d), is amended by adding at the
end the following:

18 "(5) VERY POOR.—The term 'very poor' means
19 those individuals—

20 "(A) living in the bottom 50 percent below
21 the poverty line established by the national gov22 ernment of the country in which those individ23 uals live; or

24 "(B) living on less than the equivalent of25 \$1 per day.".

1 SEC. 4. REPORT TO CONGRESS.

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than September 30,
3 2005, the Administrator of the United States Agency for
4 International Development shall submit to Congress a re5 port that documents the process of developing and apply6 ing poverty assessment procedures with its partners.

7 (b) REPORTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2006 AND BE-8 YOND.—Beginning with fiscal year 2006, the Administrator of the United States Agency for International De-9 velopment shall annually submit to Congress on a timely 10 11 basis a report that addresses the United States Agency for International Development's compliance with the 12 Microenterprise for Self-Reliance Act of 2000 by docu-13 menting-14

(1) the percentage of its resources that were allocated to the very poor (as defined in paragraph (5)
of section 131(f) of the Foreign Assistance Act of
1961 (22 U.S.C. 2152a(f)(5))) based on the data
collected from its partners using the certified methods; and

(2) the absolute number of the very poor
 reached.
