A BILL

To provide for uterine fibroid research and education, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Uterine Fibroid Re-
- 5 search and Education Act of 2003".
- 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 7 Congress finds as follows:
- 8 (1) The development of uterine fibroids is a
- 9 common and significant health problem, affecting
- women of all ages, racial backgrounds, and socio-
- economic levels.

- 1 (2) It has been estimated that between 20 and 2 30 percent of women of reproductive age have uterine fibroids, though not all have been diagnosed.

 Studies indicate the prevalence could be much higher.
 - (3) Symptomatic uterine fibroids can cause heavy bleeding, pain, and reproductive problems, including infertility. There is no known cause of uterine fibroids.
 - (4) Uterine fibroids are the most common indication for hysterectomy, accounting for approximately one-third of hysterectomies, or 200,000 procedures annually.
 - (5) African American women are 2 to 3 times more likely to develop uterine fibroids than women of other racial groups.
 - (6) The estimated annual charges for inpatient care for uterine fibroids totaled more than \$2,000,000,000 in 1997.
 - (7) The Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality found a "remarkable lack of high quality evidence supporting the effectiveness of most interventions for symptomatic fibroids".

SEC. 3. RESEARCH WITH RESPECT TO UTERINE FIBROIDS.

- 2 (a) In General.—The Director of the National In-
- 3 stitutes of Health (in this section referred to as the "Di-
- 4 rector of NIH") shall expand, intensify, and coordinate
- 5 programs for the conduct and support of research with
- 6 respect to uterine fibroids.
- 7 (b) Administration.—
- 8 (1) In General.—The Director of NIH shall
- 9 carry out this section through the appropriate insti-
- tutes, offices, and centers, including the National In-
- stitute of Child Health and Human Development,
- the National Institute of Environmental Health
- 13 Sciences, the Office of Research on Women's Health,
- the National Center on Minority Health and Health
- Disparities, and any other agencies that the Director
- of NIH determines to be appropriate.
- 17 (2) COORDINATION OF ACTIVITIES.—The Office
- of Research on Women's Health shall coordinate ac-
- tivities under paragraph (1) among the institutes,
- offices, and centers of the National Institutes of
- 21 Health.
- (c) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—For the
- 23 purpose of carrying out this section, there are authorized
- 24 to be appropriated \$10,000,000 for each of the fiscal years
- 25 2004 through 2008.

1	SEC. 4. INFORMATION AND EDUCATION WITH RESPECT TO
2	UTERINE FIBROIDS.
3	(a) Uterine Fibroids Public Education Pro-
4	GRAM.—
5	(1) In General.—The Secretary of Health and
6	Human Services (referred to in this section as the
7	"Secretary"), acting through the Director of the
8	Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, shall
9	develop and disseminate to the public information
10	regarding uterine fibroids, including information
11	on—
12	(A) the incidence and prevalence of uterine
13	fibroids;
14	(B) the elevated risk for minority women;
15	and
16	(C) the availability, as medically appro-
17	priate, of a range of treatment options for
18	symptomatic uterine fibroids.
19	(2) Dissemination.—The Secretary may dis-
20	seminate information under paragraph (1) directly,
21	or through arrangements with nonprofit organiza-
22	tions, consumer groups, institutions of higher edu-
23	cation (as defined in section 101 of the Higher Edu-
24	cation Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1001)), Federal,
25	State, or local agencies, or the media.

- 1 (3) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—For 2 the purpose of carrying out this subsection, there 3 are authorized to be appropriated such sums as may 4 be necessary for each of the fiscal years 2004 5 through 2008.
- (b) Uterine Fibroids Information Program for
 Health Care Providers.—
- 8 ΙN GENERAL.—The Secretary, acting 9 through the Administrator of the Health Resources 10 and Services Administration, shall develop and dis-11 seminate to health care providers information on 12 uterine fibroids, including information on the ele-13 vated risk for minority women and the range of 14 available options for the treatment of symptomatic 15 uterine fibroids.
- 16 (2) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—For 17 the purpose of carrying out this subsection, there 18 are authorized to be appropriated such sums as may 19 be necessary for each of the fiscal years 2004 20 through 2008.
- 21 (c) Definition.—For purposes of this section, the 22 term "minority", with respect to women, means women 23 who are members of racial or ethnic minority groups with-

- 2 ice Act (42 U.S.C. 300u-6).

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
