A BILL

To prohibit the Secretary of the Interior from issuing oil and gas leases on portions of the Outer Continental Shelf located off the coast of New Jersey.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. PROHIBITION ON OIL AND GAS LEASING OFF
- 4 THE COAST OF NEW JERSEY.
- 5 (a) Prohibition.—The Secretary of the Interior
- 6 shall not issue a lease, permit, or license for the explo-
- 7 ration for or extraction of oil or gas on or from submerged
- 8 lands described in subsection (b).

- 1 (b) Lands Described.—The submerged lands with
- 2 respect to which subsection (a) applies are all submerged
- 3 lands seaward from the landward boundary of the Outer
- 4 Continental Shelf that lie within 125 miles of any point
- 5 of the coast line of the State of New Jersey, including
- 6 areas with respect to which a moratorium on oil and gas
- 7 leasing activities existed before the date of enactment of

8 this Act.
