AN ACT

Making appropriations for military construction, family housing, and base realignment and closure for the Department of Defense for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2004, and for other purposes.

1 MILITARY CONSTRUCTION, ARMY

2 (INCLUDING RESCISSIONS)

3 For acquisition, construction, installation, and equip-
4 ment of temporary or permanent public works, military
5 installations, facilities, and real property for the Army as
6 currently authorized by law, including personnel in the
7 Army Corps of Engineers and other personal services nec-
8 essary for the purposes of this appropriation, and for con-
9 struction and operation of facilities in support of the func-
10 tions of the Commander in Chief, \$1,533,660,000, to re-
11 main available until September 30, 2008: *Provided*, That
12 of this amount, not to exceed \$122,710,000 shall be avail-
13 able for study, planning, design, architect and engineer
14 services, and host nation support, as authorized by law,
15 unless the Secretary of Defense determines that additional
16 obligations are necessary for such purposes and notifies
17 the Committees on Appropriations of both Houses of Con-
18 gress of his determination and the reasons therefor: *Pro-*
19 *vided further*, That of the funds appropriated for “Military
20 Construction, Army” under Public Law 107–249,
21 \$142,200,000 are rescinded: *Provided further*, That of the
22 funds appropriated for “Military Construction, Army”
23 under Public Law 107–64, \$24,000,000 are rescinded:

8 SEC. 106. None of the funds appropriated in Military

13 struction Appropriations Acts.

14 SEC. 107. None of the funds appropriated in Military
15 Construction Appropriations Acts for minor construction
16 may be used to transfer or relocate any activity from one
17 base or installation to another, without prior notification
18 to the Committees on Appropriations.

19 SEC. 108. No part of the funds appropriated in Mili-
20 tary Construction Appropriations Acts may be used for
21 the procurement of steel for any construction project or
22 activity for which American steel producers, fabricators,
23 and manufacturers have been denied the opportunity to
24 compete for such steel procurement.

1 SEC. 109. None of the funds available to the Depart-
2 ment of Defense for military construction or family hous-
3 ing during the current fiscal year may be used to pay real
4 property taxes in any foreign nation.

5 SEC. 110. None of the funds appropriated in Military
6 Construction Appropriations Acts may be used to initiate
7 a new installation overseas without prior notification to
8 the Committees on Appropriations.

9 SEC. 111. None of the funds appropriated in Military
10 Construction Appropriations Acts may be obligated for ar-
11 chitect and engineer contracts estimated by the Govern-
12 ment to exceed \$500,000 for projects to be accomplished
13 in Japan, in any NATO member country, or in countries
14 bordering the Arabian Sea, unless such contracts are
15 awarded to United States firms or United States firms
16 in joint venture with host nation firms.

17 SEC. 112. None of the funds appropriated in Military
18 Construction Appropriations Acts for military construc-
19 tion in the United States territories and possessions in the
20 Pacific and on Kwajalein Atoll, or in countries bordering
21 the Arabian Sea, may be used to award any contract esti-
22 mated by the Government to exceed \$1,000,000 to a for-
23 eign contractor. *Provided,* That this section shall not be
24 applicable to contract awards for which the lowest respon-
25 sive and responsible bid of a United States contractor ex-

1 Act, 1991, to be merged with, and to be available for the
2 same purposes and the same time period as that account.

3 (TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

4 SEC. 121. Subject to 30 days prior notification to the
5 Committees on Appropriations, such additional amounts
6 as may be determined by the Secretary of Defense may
7 be transferred to the Department of Defense Family
8 Housing Improvement Fund from amounts appropriated
9 for construction in "Family Housing" accounts, to be
10 merged with and to be available for the same purposes
11 and for the same period of time as amounts appropriated
12 directly to the Fund: *Provided*, That appropriations made
13 available to the Fund shall be available to cover the costs,
14 as defined in section 502(5) of the Congressional Budget
15 Act of 1974, of direct loans or loan guarantees issued by
16 the Department of Defense pursuant to the provisions of
17 subchapter IV of chapter 169, title 10, United States
18 Code, pertaining to alternative means of acquiring and im-
19 proving military family housing and supporting facilities.

20 SEC. 122. None of the funds appropriated or made
21 available by this Act may be obligated for Partnership for
22 Peace Programs in the New Independent States of the
23 former Soviet Union.

24 (TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

25 SEC. 123. During the current fiscal year, in addition
26 to any other transfer authority available to the Depart-

1 ment of Defense, amounts may be transferred from the
2 account established by section 2906(a)(1) of the Depart-
3 ment of Defense Authorization Act, 1991, to the fund es-
4 tablished by section 1013(d) of the Demonstration Cities
5 and Metropolitan Development Act of 1966 (42 U.S.C.
6 3374) to pay for expenses associated with the Home-
7 owners Assistance Program. Any amounts transferred
8 shall be merged with and be available for the same pur-
9 poses and for the same time period as the fund to which
10 transferred.

11 SEC. 124. Notwithstanding this or any other provi-
12 sion of law, funds appropriated in Military Construction
13 Appropriations Acts for operations and maintenance of
14 family housing shall be the exclusive source of funds for
15 repair and maintenance of all family housing units, includ-
16 ing general or flag officer quarters: *Provided*, That not
17 more than \$35,000 per unit may be spent annually for
18 the maintenance and repair of any general or flag officer
19 quarters without 30 days advance prior notification to the
20 appropriate committees of Congress, except that an after-
21 the-fact notification shall be submitted if the limitation is
22 exceeded solely due to costs associated with environmental
23 remediation that could not be reasonably anticipated at
24 the time of the budget submission: *Provided further*, That
25 the Under Secretary of Defense (Comptroller) is to report

1 annually to the Committees on Appropriations all oper-
2 ations and maintenance expenditures for each individual
3 general or flag officer quarters for the prior fiscal year.

4 SEC. 125. None of the funds made available in this
5 Act may be transferred to any department, agency, or in-
6 strumentality of the United States Government, except
7 pursuant to a transfer made by, or transfer authority pro-
8 vided in, this Act or any other appropriation Act.

9 SEC. 126. None of the funds appropriated in this Act
10 for the Department of the Army for military construction
11 projects in the Republic of Korea may be obligated or ex-
12 pended for projects at Camp Humphreys in the Republic
13 of Korea until the Secretary of Defense certifies and re-
14 ports to the appropriate committees of Congress that the
15 United States and the Republic of Korea have entered into
16 an agreement on the availability and use of land sufficient
17 for such projects. The certification must be presented to
18 the committees no later than September 30, 2004, or the
19 funds expire.

17 *GENERAL PROVISIONS—MILITARY*

18 *CONSTRUCTION*

19 *SEC. 101. None of the funds appropriated in Military*
20 *Construction Appropriations Acts shall be expended for*
21 *payments under a cost-plus-a-fixed-fee contract for con-*
22 *struction, where cost estimates exceed \$25,000, to be per-*
23 *formed within the United States, except Alaska, without the*
24 *specific approval in writing of the Secretary of Defense set-*
25 *ting forth the reasons therefor.*

1 *SEC. 102. Funds appropriated to the Department of*
2 *Defense for construction shall be available for hire of pas-*
3 *senger motor vehicles.*

4 *SEC. 103. Funds appropriated to the Department of*
5 *Defense for construction may be used for advances to the*
6 *Federal Highway Administration, Department of Trans-*
7 *portation, for the construction of access roads as authorized*
8 *by section 210 of title 23, United States Code, when projects*
9 *authorized therein are certified as important to the national*
10 *defense by the Secretary of Defense.*

11 *SEC. 104. None of the funds appropriated in this Act*
12 *may be used to begin construction of new bases inside the*
13 *continental United States for which specific appropriations*
14 *have not been made.*

15 *SEC. 105. No part of the funds provided in Military*
16 *Construction Appropriations Acts shall be used for purchase*
17 *of land or land easements in excess of 100 percent of the*
18 *value as determined by the Army Corps of Engineers or*
19 *the Naval Facilities Engineering Command, except: (1)*
20 *where there is a determination of value by a Federal court;*
21 *(2) purchases negotiated by the Attorney General or his des-*
22 *ignee; (3) where the estimated value is less than \$25,000;*
23 *or (4) as otherwise determined by the Secretary of Defense*
24 *to be in the public interest.*

1 *SEC. 106. None of the funds appropriated in Military*
2 *Construction Appropriations Acts shall be used to: (1) ac-*
3 *quire land; (2) provide for site preparation; or (3) install*
4 *utilities for any family housing, except housing for which*
5 *funds have been made available in annual Military Con-*
6 *struction Appropriations Acts.*

7 *SEC. 107. None of the funds appropriated in Military*
8 *Construction Appropriations Acts for minor construction*
9 *may be used to transfer or relocate any activity from one*
10 *base or installation to another, without prior notification*
11 *to the Committees on Appropriations.*

12 *SEC. 108. No part of the funds appropriated in Mili-*
13 *tary Construction Appropriations Acts may be used for the*
14 *procurement of steel for any construction project or activity*
15 *for which American steel producers, fabricators, and manu-*
16 *facturers have been denied the opportunity to compete for*
17 *such steel procurement.*

18 *SEC. 109. None of the funds available to the Depart-*
19 *ment of Defense for military construction or family housing*
20 *during the current fiscal year may be used to pay real prop-*
21 *erty taxes in any foreign nation.*

22 *SEC. 110. None of the funds appropriated in Military*
23 *Construction Appropriations Acts may be used to initiate*
24 *a new installation overseas without prior notification to the*
25 *Committees on Appropriations.*

1 *SEC. 111. None of the funds appropriated in Military*
2 *Construction Appropriations Acts may be obligated for ar-*
3 *chitect and engineer contracts estimated by the Government*
4 *to exceed \$500,000 for projects to be accomplished in Japan,*
5 *in any NATO member country, or in countries bordering*
6 *the Arabian Sea, unless such contracts are awarded to*
7 *United States firms or United States firms in joint venture*
8 *with host nation firms.*

9 *SEC. 112. None of the funds appropriated in Military*
10 *Construction Appropriations Acts for military construction*
11 *in the United States territories and possessions in the Pa-*
12 *cific and on Kwajalein Atoll, or in countries bordering the*
13 *Arabian Sea, may be used to award any contract estimated*
14 *by the Government to exceed \$1,000,000 to a foreign con-*
15 *tractor: Provided, That this section shall not be applicable*
16 *to contract awards for which the lowest responsive and re-*
17 *sponsible bid of a United States contractor exceeds the low-*
18 *est responsive and responsible bid of a foreign contractor*
19 *by greater than 20 percent: Provided further, That this sec-*
20 *tion shall not apply to contract awards for military con-*
21 *struction on Kwajalein Atoll for which the lowest responsive*
22 *and responsible bid is submitted by a Marshallese con-*
23 *tractor.*

24 *SEC. 113. The Secretary of Defense is to inform the*
25 *appropriate committees of Congress, including the Commit-*

1 *tees on Appropriations, of the plans and scope of any pro-*
2 *posed military exercise involving United States personnel*
3 *30 days prior to its occurring, if amounts expended for con-*
4 *struction, either temporary or permanent, are anticipated*
5 *to exceed \$100,000.*

6 *SEC. 114. Not more than 20 percent of the appropri-*
7 *ations in Military Construction Appropriations Acts which*
8 *are limited for obligation during the current fiscal year*
9 *shall be obligated during the last 2 months of the fiscal year.*

10 *(TRANSFER OF FUNDS)*

11 *SEC. 115. Funds appropriated to the Department of*
12 *Defense for construction in prior years shall be available*
13 *for construction authorized for each such military depart-*
14 *ment by the authorizations enacted into law during the cur-*
15 *rent session of Congress.*

16 *SEC. 116. For military construction or family housing*
17 *projects that are being completed with funds otherwise ex-*
18 *pired or lapsed for obligation, expired or lapsed funds may*
19 *be used to pay the cost of associated supervision, inspection,*
20 *overhead, engineering and design on those projects and on*
21 *subsequent claims, if any.*

22 *SEC. 117. Notwithstanding any other provision of law,*
23 *any funds appropriated to a military department or de-*
24 *fense agency for the construction of military projects may*
25 *be obligated for a military construction project or contract,*
26 *or for any portion of such a project or contract, at any*

1 *time before the end of the fourth fiscal year after the fiscal*
2 *year for which funds for such project were appropriated if*
3 *the funds obligated for such project: (1) are obligated from*
4 *funds available for military construction projects; and (2)*
5 *do not exceed the amount appropriated for such project,*
6 *plus any amount by which the cost of such project is in-*
7 *creased pursuant to law.*

8 *(TRANSFER OF FUNDS)*

9 *SEC. 118. During the 5-year period after appropria-*
10 *tions available to the Department of Defense for military*
11 *construction and family housing operation and mainte-*
12 *nance and construction have expired for obligation, upon*
13 *a determination that such appropriations will not be nec-*
14 *essary for the liquidation of obligations or for making au-*
15 *thorized adjustments to such appropriations for obligations*
16 *incurred during the period of availability of such appro-*
17 *priations, unobligated balances of such appropriations may*
18 *be transferred into the appropriation "Foreign Currency*
19 *Fluctuations, Construction, Defense" to be merged with and*
20 *to be available for the same time period and for the same*
21 *purposes as the appropriation to which transferred.*

22 *SEC. 119. The Secretary of Defense is to provide the*
23 *Committees on Appropriations of the Senate and the House*
24 *of Representatives with an annual report by February 15,*
25 *containing details of the specific actions proposed to be*
26 *taken by the Department of Defense during the current fis-*

1 *cal year to encourage other member nations of the North*
2 *Atlantic Treaty Organization, Japan, Korea, and United*
3 *States allies bordering the Arabian Sea to assume a greater*
4 *share of the common defense burden of such nations and*
5 *the United States.*

6 *(TRANSFER OF FUNDS)*

7 *SEC. 120. During the current fiscal year, in addition*
8 *to any other transfer authority available to the Department*
9 *of Defense, proceeds deposited to the Department of Defense*
10 *Base Closure Account established by section 207(a)(1) of the*
11 *Defense Authorization Amendments and Base Closure and*
12 *Realignment Act (Public Law 100–526) pursuant to section*
13 *207(a)(2)(C) of such Act, may be transferred to the account*
14 *established by section 2906(a)(1) of the Department of De-*
15 *fense Authorization Act, 1991, to be merged with, and to*
16 *be available for the same purposes and the same time period*
17 *as that account.*

18 *(TRANSFER OF FUNDS)*

19 *SEC. 121. Subject to 30 days prior notification to the*
20 *Committees on Appropriations, such additional amounts as*
21 *may be determined by the Secretary of Defense may be*
22 *transferred to the Department of Defense Family Housing*
23 *Improvement Fund from amounts appropriated for con-*
24 *struction in “Family Housing” accounts, to be merged with*
25 *and to be available for the same purposes and for the same*
26 *period of time as amounts appropriated directly to the*

1 *Fund: Provided, That appropriations made available to the*
2 *Fund shall be available to cover the costs, as defined in sec-*
3 *tion 502(5) of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974, of di-*
4 *rect loans or loan guarantees issued by the Department of*
5 *Defense pursuant to the provisions of subchapter IV of chap-*
6 *ter 169, title 10, United States Code, pertaining to alter-*
7 *native means of acquiring and improving military family*
8 *housing and supporting facilities.*

9 *SEC. 122. None of the funds appropriated or made*
10 *available by this Act may be obligated for Partnership for*
11 *Peace Programs in the New Independent States of the*
12 *former Soviet Union.*

13 *SEC. 123. (a) Not later than 60 days before issuing*
14 *any solicitation for a contract with the private sector for*
15 *military family housing the Secretary of the military de-*
16 *partment concerned shall submit to the congressional de-*
17 *fense committees the notice described in subsection (b).*

18 *(b)(1) A notice referred to in subsection (a) is a notice*
19 *of any guarantee (including the making of mortgage or*
20 *rental payments) proposed to be made by the Secretary to*
21 *the private party under the contract involved in the event*
22 *of—*

23 *(A) the closure or realignment of the installation*
24 *for which housing is provided under the contract;*

1 *be available for the same purposes and for the same time*
2 *period as the fund to which transferred.*

3 *SEC. 125. Notwithstanding this or any other provision*
4 *of law, funds appropriated in Military Construction Ap-*
5 *propriations Acts for operations and maintenance of family*
6 *housing shall be the exclusive source of funds for repair and*
7 *maintenance of all family housing units, including general*
8 *or flag officer quarters: Provided, That not more than*
9 *\$35,000 per unit may be spent annually for the mainte-*
10 *nance and repair of any general or flag officer quarters*
11 *without 30 days advance prior notification to the appro-*
12 *priate committees of Congress, except that an after-the-fact*
13 *notification shall be submitted if the limitation is exceeded*
14 *solely due to costs associated with environmental remedi-*
15 *ation that could not be reasonably anticipated at the time*
16 *of the budget submission: Provided further, That the Under*
17 *Secretary of Defense (Comptroller) is to report annually to*
18 *the Committees on Appropriations all operations and*
19 *maintenance expenditures for each individual general or*
20 *flag officer quarters for the prior fiscal year: Provided fur-*
21 *ther, That nothing herein precludes the Secretary concerned*
22 *from using funds pursuant to 10 U.S.C. 2601.*

23 *SEC. 126. None of the funds made available in this*
24 *Act may be transferred to any department, agency, or in-*
25 *strumentality of the United States Government, except pur-*

1 *suant to a transfer made by, or transfer authority provided*
2 *in, this Act or any other appropriation Act.*

3 *SEC. 127. No funds appropriated in this Act under*
4 *the heading “North Atlantic Treaty Organization Security*
5 *Investment Program”, and no funds appropriated for any*
6 *fiscal year before fiscal year 2004 for that program that*
7 *remain available for obligation, may be obligated or ex-*
8 *pended for the conduct of studies of missile defense.*

9 *SEC. 128. (a) COMMISSION ON REVIEW OF OVERSEAS*
10 *MILITARY FACILITY STRUCTURE OF THE UNITED*
11 *STATES.—(1) There is established the Commission on the*
12 *Review of the Overseas Military Facility Structure of the*
13 *United States (in this section referred to as the “Commis-*
14 *sion”).*

15 *(2)(A) The Commission shall be composed of 8 mem-*
16 *bers of whom—*

17 *(i) 2 shall be appointed by the Majority Leader*
18 *of the Senate;*

19 *(ii) 2 shall be appointed by the Minority Leader*
20 *of the Senate;*

21 *(iii) 2 shall be appointed by the Speaker of the*
22 *House of Representatives; and*

23 *(iv) 2 shall be appointed by the Minority Leader*
24 *of the House of Representatives.*

1 (B) *Individuals appointed to the Commission shall*
2 *have significant experience in the national security or for-*
3 *ign policy of the United States.*

4 (C) *Appointments of the members of the Commission*
5 *shall be made not later than 45 days after the date of the*
6 *enactment of this Act.*

7 (3) *Members shall be appointed for the life of the Com-*
8 *mission. Any vacancy in the Commission shall not affect*
9 *its powers, but shall be filled in the same manner as the*
10 *original appointment.*

11 (4) *Not later than 30 days after the date on which*
12 *all members of the Commission have been appointed, the*
13 *Commission shall hold its first meeting.*

14 (5) *The Commission shall meet at the call of the Chair-*
15 *man.*

16 (6) *A majority of the members of the Commission shall*
17 *constitute a quorum, but a lesser number of members may*
18 *hold hearings.*

19 (7) *The Commission shall select a Chairman and Vice*
20 *Chairman from among its members.*

21 (b) *DUTIES.—(1) The Commission shall conduct a*
22 *thorough study of matters relating to the military facility*
23 *structure of the United States overseas.*

24 (2) *In conducting the study, the Commission shall—*

1 (A) assess the number of forces required to be for-
2 ward based outside the United States;

3 (B) examine the current state of the military fa-
4 cilities and training ranges of the United States over-
5 seas for all permanent stations and deployed loca-
6 tions, including the condition of land and improve-
7 ments at such facilities and ranges and the avail-
8 ability of additional land, if required, for such facili-
9 ties and ranges;

10 (C) identify the amounts received by the United
11 States, whether in direct payments, in-kind contribu-
12 tions, or otherwise, from foreign countries by reason
13 of military facilities of the United States overseas;

14 (D) assess whether or not the current military
15 basing and training range structure of the United
16 States overseas is adequate to meet the current and
17 future mission of the Department of Defense, includ-
18 ing contingency, mobilization, and future force re-
19 quirements;

20 (E) assess the feasibility and advisability of the
21 closure or realignment of military facilities of the
22 United States overseas, or of the establishment of new
23 military facilities of the United States overseas; and

1 (F) consider or assess any other issue relating to
2 military facilities of the United States overseas that
3 the Commission considers appropriate.

4 (3)(A) Not later than August 30, 2004, the Commission
5 shall submit to the President and Congress a report which
6 shall contain a detailed statement of the findings and con-
7 clusions of the Commission, together with its recommenda-
8 tions for such legislation and administrative actions as it
9 considers appropriate.

10 (B) In addition to the matters specified in subpara-
11 graph (A), the report shall also include a proposal by the
12 Commission for an overseas basing strategy for the Depart-
13 ment of Defense in order to meet the current and future
14 mission of the Department.

15 (c) *POWERS.*—(1) The Commission may hold such
16 hearings, sit and act at such times and places, take such
17 testimony, and receive such evidence as the Commission
18 considers advisable to carry out this section.

19 (2) The Commission may secure directly from any
20 Federal department or agency such information as the
21 Commission considers necessary to carry out this section.
22 Upon request of the Chairman of the Commission, the head
23 of such department or agency shall furnish such informa-
24 tion to the Commission.

1 (3) *Upon request of the Commission, the Adminis-*
2 *trator of General Services shall provide to the Commission,*
3 *on a reimbursable basis, the administrative support nec-*
4 *essary for the Commission to carry out its duties under this*
5 *section.*

6 (4) *The Commission may use the United States mails*
7 *in the same manner and under the same conditions as other*
8 *departments and agencies of the Federal Government.*

9 (5) *The Commission may accept, use, and dispose of*
10 *gifts or donations of services or property.*

11 (d) *PERSONNEL MATTERS.—(1) Each member of the*
12 *Commission who is not an officer or employee of the Federal*
13 *Government shall be compensated at a rate equal to the*
14 *daily equivalent of the annual rate of basic pay prescribed*
15 *for level IV of the Executive Schedule under section 5315*
16 *of title 5, United States Code, for each day (including travel*
17 *time) during which such member is engaged in the perform-*
18 *ance of the duties of the Commission under this section. All*
19 *members of the Commission who are officers or employees*
20 *of the United States shall serve without compensation in*
21 *addition to that received for their services as officers or em-*
22 *ployees of the United States.*

23 (2)(A) *Members of the Commission shall be allowed*
24 *travel expenses, including per diem in lieu of subsistence,*
25 *at rates authorized for employees of agencies under sub-*

1 *chapter I of chapter 57 of title 5, United States Code, while*
2 *away from their homes or regular places of business in the*
3 *performance of services for the Commission under this sec-*
4 *tion.*

5 *(B) Members and staff of the Commission may receive*
6 *transportation on aircraft of the Military Airlift Command*
7 *to and from the United States, and overseas, for purposes*
8 *of the performance of the duties of the Commission to the*
9 *extent that such transportation will not interfere with the*
10 *requirements of military operations.*

11 *(3)(A) The Chairman of the Commission may, without*
12 *regard to the civil service laws and regulations, appoint*
13 *and terminate an executive director and such other addi-*
14 *tional personnel as may be necessary to enable the Commis-*
15 *sion to perform its duties under this section. The employ-*
16 *ment of an executive director shall be subject to confirma-*
17 *tion by the Commission.*

18 *(B) The Commission may employ a staff to assist the*
19 *Commission in carrying out its duties. The total number*
20 *of the staff of the Commission, including an executive direc-*
21 *tor under subparagraph (A), may not exceed 12.*

22 *(C) The Chairman of the Commission may fix the com-*
23 *ensation of the executive director and other personnel with-*
24 *out regard to chapter 51 and subchapter III of chapter 53*
25 *of title 5, United States Code, relating to classification of*

1 *positions and General Schedule pay rates, except that the*
2 *rate of pay for the executive director and other personnel*
3 *may not exceed the rate payable for level V of the Executive*
4 *Schedule under section 5316 of such title.*

5 (4) *Any employee of the Department of Defense, the*
6 *Department of State, or the General Accounting Office may*
7 *be detailed to the Commission without reimbursement, and*
8 *such detail shall be without interruption or loss of civil*
9 *service status or privilege.*

10 (5) *The Chairman of the Commission may procure*
11 *temporary and intermittent services under section 3109(b)*
12 *of title 5, United States Code, at rates for individuals which*
13 *do not exceed the daily equivalent of the annual rate of basic*
14 *pay prescribed for level V of the Executive Schedule under*
15 *section 5316 of such title.*

16 (e) *SECURITY.—(1) Members and staff of the Commis-*
17 *sion, and any experts and consultants to the Commission,*
18 *shall possess security clearances appropriate for their duties*
19 *with the Commission under this section.*

20 (2) *The Secretary of Defense shall assume responsi-*
21 *bility for the handling and disposition of any information*
22 *relating to the national security of the United States that*
23 *is received, considered, or used by the Commission under*
24 *this section.*
