Mr. CASE introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee

A BILL

To provide for the expansion of Kilauea Point National
Wildlife Refuge.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Kilauea Point National
5 Wildlife Refuge Expansion Act of 2003” .

6 **SEC. 2. EXPANSION OF KILAUEA POINT NATIONAL WILD-**
7 **LIFE REFUGE.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of the Interior may
9 acquire all or a portion of the land or interests in land
10 described in subsection (b), as depicted on a map on file
11 with the United States Fish and Wildlife Service entitled

1 “Kilauea Point Wildlife Refuge Expansion Area” and
2 dated _____, 2003.

3 (b) DESCRIPTION OF LAND.—The land referred to in
4 subsection (a) is the following:

5 (1) Parcel 1, consisting of approximately 12
6 acres known as the Kilauea Bay property.

7 (2) Parcel 2, consisting of approximately 45
8 acres known as the Kilauea Vistas property.

9 (3) Parcel 3, consisting of approximately 162
10 acres known as the Kilauea Falls Ranch.

11 (c) BOUNDARY REVISIONS.—The Secretary may
12 make such minor revisions in the boundaries of any of the
13 parcels described in subsection (b) as may be appropriate
14 to facilitate the acquisition of land or interests under sub-
15 section (a).

16 (d) INCLUSION IN REFUGE.—Land and interests ac-
17 quired under this section shall become part of the Kilauea
18 Point National Wildlife Refuge.

19 (e) REFUGE PURPOSES.—Upon acquisition of any
20 land or interest in land described in subsection (b), the
21 purposes of the Kilauea Point National Wildlife Refuge
22 shall include—

23 (1) the protection and recovery of endangered
24 Hawaiian waterbirds and the endangered Nene (Ha-
25 waiian goose); and

- 1 (2) the conservation and management of native
- 2 coastal strand, riparian, and aquatic biological diver-
- 3 sity.
