## A BILL

To require advance notification of Congress regarding any action proposed to be taken by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs in the implementation of the Capital Asset Realignment for Enhanced Services initiative of the Department of Veterans Affairs, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. ADVANCE NOTIFICATION OF A DEPARTMENT
4 OF VETERANS AFFAIRS CAPITAL ASSET RE5 ALIGNMENT INITIATIVE.

6 (a) REQUIREMENT FOR ADVANCE NOTIFICATION.—
7 Before taking any action proposed under the Capital Asset

Realignment for Enhanced Services initiative of the De partment of Veterans Affairs, the Secretary of Veterans
 Affairs shall submit to Congress a written notification of
 the intent to take such action.

5 (b) LIMITATION.—The Secretary of Veterans Affairs
6 may not take any proposed action described in subsection
7 (a) until the later of—

8 (1) the expiration of the 60-day period begin-9 ning on the date on which the Secretary submits to 10 Congress the notification of the proposed action re-11 quired under subsection (a); or

(2) the expiration of a period of 30 days of continuous session of Congress beginning on such date
of notification or, if either House of Congress is not
in session on such date, the first day after such date
that both Houses of Congress are in session.

17 (c) CONTINUOUS SESSION OF CONGRESS.—For the18 purposes of subsection (b)—

(1) the continuity of session of Congress is broken only by an adjournment of Congress sine die;
and

(2) the days on which either House is not in
session because of an adjournment of more than
three days to a day certain are excluded in the com-
