 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Equitable Care for All

5 Veterans Act".

1SEC. 2. REVISION TO MEDICAL CARE FUNDING ALLOCA-2TION FORMULA FOR DEPARTMENT OF VET-3ERANS AFFAIRS.

4 (a) MODIFICATION TO VERA FORMULA.—The fund-5 ing allocation formula for the Department of Veterans Affairs medical care system known as the Veterans Equi-6 7 table Resource Allocation (VERA) system, established 8 pursuant to section 429 of Public Law 104–204 (110 9 Stat. 2929), shall be modified by the Secretary of Vet-10 erans Affairs in accordance with this section. Such modi-11 fications shall provide for the incorporation of regional dif-12 ferences in the cost of providing health care to veterans 13 (due to different regional cost of living, long travel distance, and other appropriate factors) as part of the cri-14 teria used to determine the national means differential 15 16 used in the existing system.

17 (b) EVALUATION.—At the end of the second fiscal 18 year beginning after the date of the enactment of this Act, 19 the Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall evaluate the effects of the modifications implemented pursuant to subsection 20 21 (a) on the regional allocation of funds available to the De-22 partment of Veterans Affairs for health care. The Sec-23 retary shall submit to Congress not later than 60 days 24 after the end of such fiscal year the determination of the 25 Secretary as to whether those modifications have resulted 26 in a substantive shift in the funding allocations among the

different service regions of the Veterans Health Adminis tration compared to the allocations before such modifica tions.

4 (c) CONTINGENT TERMINATION OF VERA FOR-5 MULA.—If in the report submitted pursuant to subsection (b) the Secretary of Veterans Affairs determines that the 6 7 modifications have not resulted in a substantive shift in 8 the funding allocations described in that subsection, the 9 Secretary shall immediately terminate use of the Veterans 10 Equitable Resource Allocation system for the regional allocation of funds available to the Department of Veterans 11 12 Affairs for health care.

13 SEC. 3. STANDBY ALTERNATIVE SYSTEM.

14 (a) Development of Replacement Formula.— If pursuant to section 2(c) the Secretary of Veterans Af-15 fairs is required to terminate the use of the Veterans Eq-16 17 uitable Resource Allocation system, the Secretary shall develop a new formula for the allocation of funds appro-18 19 priated to the Department of Veterans Affairs for Medical 20 Care to the national service regions, known as Veterans 21 Integrated Service Networks (VISNs), of the Department. 22 In developing such formula, the Secretary shall take the 23 following requirements into account:

24 (1) For any fiscal year for which the amount25 appropriated for Medical Care is an increase from

1	the preceding year, the funding level provided under
2	the new formula to any VISN may not be less than
3	the amount provided for the preceding year.
4	(2) The new formula shall take into account ad-
5	ditional costs incurred by a VISN due to any of the
6	following factors at that VISN being in excess of the
7	median for all VISNs:
8	(A) The number of veterans moving into
9	the geographic area of that VISN.
10	(B) The median age of veterans in that
11	VISN.
12	(C) The number of veterans in that VISN
13	requiring complex care or nursing home care.
14	(D) The age of Department of Veterans
15	Affairs health care facilities in that VISN.
16	(b) TRANSITION FORMULA.—Until a replacement
17	funding allocation formula is implemented pursuant to
18	subsection (a), the funding allocation formula to be ap-
19	plied by the Secretary to amounts appropriated for vet-
20	erans medical care shall be the formula in effect before
21	the Veterans Equitable Resource Allocation system.
22	SEC. 4. AUTHORIZATIONS OF APPROPRIATIONS.
23	(a) Authorization for Replacement Alloca-

23 (a) AUTHORIZATION FOR REPLACEMENT ALLOCA-24 TION FORMULA.—There is authorized to be appropriated

to the Department of Veterans Affairs for fiscal year 2003
 the amount of \$10,000,000 for purposes of this Act.

3 (b) ADDITIONAL "MEDICAL CARE" AUTHORIZA-4 TIONS.—There is authorized to be appropriated to the De-5 partment of Veterans Affairs for fiscal year 2003 the amount of \$100,000,000 for "Medical Care" for the De-6 7 partment of Veterans Affairs. Such amount is in addition 8 to any other amount authorized to be appropriated to the 9 Department of Veterans Affairs for fiscal year 2003 and 10 shall be allocated by the Secretary to the national service regions, known as Veterans Integrated Service Networks 11 12 (VISNs), of the Department of Veterans Affairs on the 13 basis of need, as follows:

- (1) First, to the VISN that has experienced the
 greatest reduction in funding from the funding levels
 for fiscal year 1997.
- 17 (2) Second, to any other VISN that has experi-18 enced an overall five-year funding decrease.

(3) Third, if any amount appropriated pursuant
to such authorization remains after allocations pursuant to paragraphs (1) and (2), such amount shall
be allocated equally among the remaining 22 VISNs
before implementation of the new formula.

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
