A BILL

- To provide for a pilot program to be conducted by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs through the establishment of an electronic database to enable healthcare facilities of the Department of Veterans Affairs in Iowa to share patient information with the State of Iowa Veterans Home on patients of both those facilities and that home.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1SECTION 1. PILOT PROGRAM FOR CREATION OF ELEC-2TRONIC DATABASE OF AUTHORIZED PATIENT3INFORMATION.

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Veterans Affairs 5 shall conduct a pilot program to determine the feasibility of electronically sharing individually identifiable health in-6 7 formation of patients of a facility of the Department of 8 Veterans Affairs with State veterans homes. In order to 9 conduct this pilot program, the Secretary shall enter into 10 an agreement with the appropriate state official of Iowa 11 to create an electronic database system that contains indi-12 vidually identifiable health information on any individual 13 who is a patient of both a facility of the Department of Veterans Affairs in Iowa and the State of Iowa Veterans 14 Home and who gives an authorization for inclusion of that 15 information in the database. 16

17 (b) TERMS OF AGREEMENT.—The Secretary of Vet18 erans Affairs shall require that the agreement under sub19 section (a) include:

20 (1) Standards for determining which officials at
21 the Iowa Veterans Home and at the Department of
22 Veterans Affairs may access the database.

23 (2) Provisions for an individual to revoke any
24 authorization given by that individual under sub25 section (a).

(3) Provisions for removing any individually
 identifiable health information for which the indi vidual revokes an authorization, pursuant to the
 standards described in paragraph (2).

5 (4) Such additional terms and conditions as the
6 Secretary considers necessary to carry out the provi7 sions of subsection (a).

8 (c) IMPLEMENTATION DEADLINE.—The Secretary of 9 Veterans Affairs shall enter into the agreement under sub-10 section (a) not later than six months after the date of the 11 enactment of this Act.

12 (d) DURATION OF PROGRAM.—The pilot program
13 shall be conducted during the three-year period beginning
14 on the date of the enactment of this Act.

(e) REPORT.—Not later than six months after the
end of the pilot program under this section, the Secretary
of Veterans Affairs shall submit to Congress a report providing the results of the pilot program. The Secretary shall
include in the report the following:

20 (1) The Secretary's assessment of the benefits21 to veterans of the pilot program.

(2) The Secretary's assessment of the effect of
the pilot program on the Department of Veterans
Affairs, including the effect on delivery of health
care to veterans.

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(3) Any other findings and conclusions of the
 Secretary with respect to the pilot program.

3 (4) Any recommendations of the Secretary for
4 continuation of the pilot program or for extension of
5 the pilot program to other States.

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
