A BILL

- To require States to hold special elections to fill vacancies in the House of Representatives not later than 21 days after the vacancy is announced by the Speaker of the House of Representatives in extraordinary circumstances, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Continuity in Represen-
- 5 *tation Act of 2003*".

6 SEC. 2. REQUIRING SPECIAL ELECTIONS TO BE HELD TO

- 7 FILL VACANCIES IN HOUSE IN EXTRAOR8 DINARY CIRCUMSTANCES.
- 9 Section 26 of the Revised Statutes of the United States
 10 (2 U.S.C. 8) is amended—
- 11 (1) by striking "The time" and inserting "(a) IN
- 12 GENERAL.—Except as provided in subsection (b), the
- 13 *time"; and*
- 14 (2) by adding at the end the following new sub-15 section:
- 16 "(b) Special Rules in Extraordinary Cir-17 cumstances.—

1	"(1) IN GENERAL.—In extraordinary cir-
2	cumstances, the executive authority of any State in
3	which a vacancy exists in its representation in the
4	House of Representatives shall issue a writ of election
5	to fill such vacancy by special election.
6	"(2) TIMING OF SPECIAL ELECTION.—A special
7	election held under this subsection to fill a vacancy
8	shall take place not later than 45 days after the
9	Speaker of the House of Representatives announces
10	that the vacancy exists, unless a regularly scheduled
11	general election for the office involved is to be held at
12	any time during the 75-day period which begins on
13	the date of the announcement of the vacancy.
14	"(3) Nominations by parties.—If a special
15	election is to be held under this subsection, not later
16	than 10 days after the Speaker announces that the va-
17	cancy exists, the political parties of the State that are
18	authorized to nominate candidates by State law may
19	each nominate one candidate to run in the election.
20	"(4) Extraordinary circumstances.—
21	"(A) IN GENERAL.—In this subsection, 'ex-
22	traordinary circumstances' occur when the
23	Speaker of the House of Representatives an-
24	nounces that vacancies in the representation
25	from the States in the House exceed 100.

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1	"(B) JUDICIAL REVIEW.—If any action is
2	brought for declaratory or injunctive relief to
3	challenge an announcement made under sub-
4	paragraph (A), the following rules shall apply:
5	"(i) Not later than 2 days after the an-
6	nouncement, the action shall be filed in the
7	United States District Court having juris-
8	diction in the district of the Member of the
9	House of Representatives whose seat has
10	been announced to be vacant and shall be
11	heard by a 3-judge court convened pursuant
12	to section 2284 of title 28, United States
13	Code.
14	"(ii) A copy of the complaint shall be
15	delivered promptly to the Clerk of the House
16	of Representatives.
17	"(iii) A final decision in the action
18	shall be made within 3 days of the filing of
19	such action and shall not be reviewable.
20	"(iv) The executive authority of the
21	State that contains the district of the Mem-
22	ber of the House of Representatives whose
23	seat has been announced to be vacant shall
24	have the right to intervene either in support
25	of or opposition to the position of a party

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1	to the case regarding the announcement of
2	such vacancy.".

1 section to fill a vacancy shall take place not later than 45 days after the Speaker 2 of the House of Representatives an-3 nounces that the vacancy exists, unless a 4 regularly scheduled general election for 5 the office involved is to be held at any 6 time during the 75-day period which be-7 8 gins on the date of the announcement of the vacancy. 9

"(3) NOMINATIONS BY PARTIES.—If a 10 11 special election is to be held under this 12 subsection, not later than 10 days after 13 the Speaker announces that the vacancy exists, the political parties of the State 14 that are authorized to nominate can-15 didates by State law may each nominate 16 17 one candidate to run in the election.

18 "(4) EXTRAORDINARY CIRCUMSTANCES.—

19 "(A) IN GENERAL.—In this sub20 section, 'extraordinary circumstances'
21 occur when the Speaker of the House
22 of Representatives announces that
23 vacancies in the representation from
24 the States in the House exceed 100.

1	"(B) JUDICIAL REVIEW.—If any ac-
2	tion is brought for declaratory or in-
3	junctive relief to challenge an an-
4	nouncement made under subpara-
5	graph (A), the following rules shall
6	apply:
7	"(i) Not later than 2 days after
8	the announcement, the action
9	shall be filed in the United States
10	District Court having jurisdiction
11	in the district of the Member of
12	the House of Representatives
13	whose seat has been announced
14	to be vacant and shall be heard
15	by a 3-judge court convened pur-
16	suant to section 2284 of title 28,
17	United States Code.
18	"(ii) A copy of the complaint
19	shall be delivered promptly to the
20	Clerk of the House of Representa-
21	tives.
22	"(iii) A final decision in the
23	action shall be made within 3
24	days of the filing of such action
25	and shall not be reviewable.

"(iv) The executive authority 1 2 of the State that contains the district of the Member of the House 3 of Representatives whose seat has 4 been announced to be vacant 5 shall have the right to intervene 6 either in support of or opposition 7 to the position of a party to the 8 case regarding the announcement 9 of such vacancy.". 10

Amend the title so as to read: "A bill to require States to hold special elections to fill vacancies in the House of Representatives not later than 45 days after the vacancy is announced by the Speaker of the House of Representatives in extraordinary circumstances, and for other purposes.".

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
