- 2 Chapter 113B of title 18, United States Code, is

- 4 (1) in the chapter analysis, by adding at the

  - "2339E. Denial of federal benefits to terrorists.";

### 8 "§ 2339E. Denial of federal benefits to terrorists

- 9 "(a) IN GENERAL.—Any individual who is convicted
- 10 of a Federal crime of terrorism (as defined in section
- 11 2332b(g)(5)) shall, as provided by the court on motion of
- 12 the government, be ineligible for any or all Federal bene-
- 13 fits for any term of years or for life.
- 14 "(b) Definition.—As used in this section, 'Federal
- 15 benefit' has the meaning given that term in section 421(d)
- 16 of the Controlled Substances Act (21 U.S.C. 862(d)).".
