## A BILL

To provide for the establishment of campaign medals to be awarded to members of the Armed Forces who participate in Operation Enduring Freedom or Operation Iraqi Freedom.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. MILITARY CAMPAIGN MEDALS TO RECOGNIZE
- 4 SERVICE IN OPERATION ENDURING FREE-
- 5 DOM AND OPERATION IRAQI FREEDOM.
- 6 (a) Requirement.—The President shall establish a
- 7 campaign medal specifically to recognize service by mem-

- 1 bers of the Armed Forces in Operation Enduring Freedom
- 2 and a separate campaign medal specifically to recognize
- 3 service by members of the Armed Forces in Operation
- 4 Iraqi Freedom.
- 5 (b) Eligibility.—Subject to such limitations as may
- 6 be prescribed by the President, eligibility for a campaign
- 7 medal established pursuant to subsection (a) shall be set
- 8 forth in uniform regulations to be prescribed by the Secre-
- 9 taries of the military departments and approved by the
- 10 Secretary of Defense or in regulations to be prescribed by
- 11 the Secretary of Homeland Security with respect to the
- 12 Coast Guard when it is not operating as a service in the
- 13 Navy.
