## A BILL

To provide access to welfare tools to help Americans get back to work.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. ELIGIBILITY OF PUERTO RICO, THE UNITED

STATES VIRGIN ISLANDS, AND GUAM FOR

THE TANF SUPPLEMENTAL GRANT FOR POP
ULATION INCREASES.
