A BILL

To correct certain inequities in the second round of designation of empowerment zones and enterprise communities.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. CORRECTION OF INEQUITIES IN THE SECOND

- 4 ROUND OF EMPOWERMENT ZONES AND EN-
- 5 **TERPRISE COMMUNITIES.**
- 6 (a) GRANT AUTHORITY.—There are authorized to be
- 7 appropriated the following amounts:

(1) URBAN EMPOWERMENT ZONES.— To the 1 2 Secretary of Housing and Urban Development, such 3 sums as may be necessary to make grant awards, to 4 each of 15 urban empowerment zones designated 5 pursuant to section 1391(g) of the Internal Revenue 6 Code of 1986, such that the sum of the grant 7 awards for each such zone and any amounts made 8 available pursuant to any prior appropriation for 9 such zone is \$100,000,000; and 10 (2) RURAL EMPOWERMENT ZONES AND ENTER-11 PRISE COMMUNITIES.—To the Secretary of Agri-12 culture, such sums as may be necessary— 13 (A) to make grant awards, to each of 5 14 rural empowerment zones designated pursuant 15 to section 1391(g) of the Internal Revenue 16 Code of 1986, such that the sum of the grant 17 awards for each such zone and any amount 18 made available pursuant to any prior appropria-19 tion for such zone is \$40,000,000; and 20 (B) to make grant awards, to each of 20

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rural enterprise communities designated pursuant to section 766 of the Agriculture, Rural Development, Food and Drug Administration, and
Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 1999 (as
contained in section 101(a) of division A of

2	that the sum of the grant awards for each such
3	community and any amount made available
4	pursuant to any prior appropriation for such
5	community is \$3,000,000
6	(b) Authority to Use Funds to Implement
7	STRATEGIC PLAN.—Funds appropriated under Federal
8	law for an empowerment zone or enterprise community re-
9	ferred to in subsection (a) may be used to implement the
10	strategic plan for the zone or community, including—
11	(1) economic development;
12	(2) infrastructure development;
13	(3) workforce development; and
14	(4) community development activities.
15	(c) Authority to Use Funds to Pay Non-Fed-
16	ERAL SHARE OF MATCHING GRANTS.—Funds appro-
17	priated under any Federal law for an empowerment zone
18	or empowerment community referred to in subsection (a)
19	may be used to pay the non-Federal share required in con-
20	nection with another Federal grant-in-aid program under-
21	taken as part of activities assisted under this section.

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
