#### **AN ACT**

- To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to provide supplemental funding and other services that are necessary to assist the State of California or local educational agencies in California in providing educational services for students attending schools located within the Park.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### 3 SECTION 1. FINDINGS AND PURPOSE.

4 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds the following:

(1) The three elementary schools serving the children of employees of Yosemite National Park are served by the Bass Lake Joint Union Elementary School District and the Mariposa Unified School

5 <del>District.</del>

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6 (2) The schools are in remote mountainous 7 areas and long distances from other educational and 8 administrative facilities of the two local educational 9 agencies.

10 (3) Because of their remote locations and rel-11 atively small number of students, schools serving the 12 children of employees of the Park provide fewer 13 services in more basic facilities than the educational 14 services and facilities provided to students that at-15 tend other schools served by the two local edu-16 cational agencies.

(4) Because of the long distances involved and
adverse weather and road conditions that occur during much of the school year, it is impractical for the
children of employees of the Park who live within or
near the Park to attend other schools served by the
two local educational agencies.

(b) PURPOSE.—The purpose of this Act is to authorize the Secretary of the Interior to provide supplemental
funding and other services that are necessary to assist the

State of California or local educational agencies in Cali fornia in providing educational services for students at tending schools located within the Park.

#### 4 SEC. 2. PAYMENTS FOR EDUCATIONAL SERVICES.

(a) AUTHORITY TO PROVIDE FUNDS.—For fiscal 5 years 2003 through 2007, the Secretary may provide 6 7 funds to the Bass Lake Joint Union Elementary School 8 District and the Mariposa Unified School District for edu-9 cational services to students who are dependents of per-10 sons engaged in the administration, operation, and maintenance of the Park or students who live at or near the 11 12 Park upon real property of the United States.

13 (b) LIMITATION ON USE OF FUNDS.—Payments made by the Secretary under this section may not be used 14 for new construction, construction contracts, or major cap-15 ital improvements, and may be used only to pay public 16 17 employees for services otherwise authorized by this Act. 18 (c) LIMITATION ON AMOUNT OF FUNDS.—Payments made under this section shall not exceed the lesser of 19 20 \$400,000 in any fiscal year or the amount necessary to 21 provide students described in subsection (a) with edu-22 cational services that are normally provided and generally available to students who attend public schools elsewhere 23 24 in the State of California.

1 (d) ADJUSTMENT OF PAYMENTS.—Subject to subsection (e), the Secretary is authorized to adjust payments 2 made under this section if the State of California or the 3 4 appropriate local education agencies do not continue to 5 provide funding for educational services at Park schools at per student levels that are equal to or greater than 6 7 those provided in the fiscal year immediately prior to the 8 date of the enactment of this section.

9 (e) Source of Payments.

10 (1) AUTHORIZED SOURCES.—Except as pro11 vided in paragraph (2), in order to make payments
12 under this section, the Secretary may use funds
13 available to the National Park Service from appro14 priations, donations, or fees.

15 (2) EXCEPTIONS.—Funds from the following
16 sources may not be used to make payments under
17 this section:

18 (A) Fees authorized and collected under
19 the Land and Water Conservation Fund Act of
20 1965 (16 U.S.C. 4601-4 et seq.).

#### 4 SEC. 101. SHORT TITLE.

5 This title may be cited as the "Yosemite National Park6 School Funding Act".

#### 7 SEC. 102. PAYMENTS FOR EDUCATIONAL SERVICES.

8 (a) AUTHORITY TO PROVIDE FUNDS.—For fiscal years 9 2004 through 2008, the Secretary may provide funds to the 10 Bass Lake Joint Union Elementary School District and the 11 Mariposa Unified School District for educational services to students who are dependents of persons engaged in the 12 administration, operation, and maintenance of the Park or 13 students who live at or near the Park upon real property 14 of the United States. 15

(b) LIMITATION ON USE OF FUNDS.—Payments made
by the Secretary under this section may not be used for
new construction, construction contracts, or major capital
improvements, and may be used only to pay public employees for services otherwise authorized by this title.

(c) LIMITATION ON AMOUNT OF FUNDS.—Payments
made under this section shall not exceed the lesser of
\$400,000 in any fiscal year or the amount necessary to provide students described in subsection (a) with educational
services that are normally provided and generally available

to students who attend public schools elsewhere in the State
 of California.

3 (d) ADJUSTMENT OF PAYMENTS.—Subject to sub-4 section (c), the Secretary is authorized to adjust payments made under this section if the State of California or the 5 appropriate local education agencies do not continue to pro-6 7 vide funding for educational services at Park schools at per 8 student levels that are equal to or greater than those provided in the fiscal year immediately prior to the date of 9 the enactment of this Act. 10

11 (e) Source of Payments.—

13 (1) by striking "The recreation area shall com14 prise" and inserting the following:

15 "(1) INITIAL LANDS.—The recreation area shall

17 (2) by striking "The following additional lands
18 are also" and all that follows through the period at
19 the end of the subsection and inserting the following
20 new paragraphs:

21 "(2) ADDITIONAL LANDS.—In addition to the
22 lands described in paragraph (1), the recreation area
23 shall include the following:

24 "(A) The parcels numbered by the Assessor

21	numbered NPS-80,079E, and dated March 2004.
22	"(3) ACQUISITION LIMITATION.—The Secretary
23	may acquire land described in paragraph $(2)(E)$ only
24	from a willing seller.".

(b) ADVISORY COMMISSION.—Section 5 of Public Law
 2 92–589 (16 U.S.C. 460bb-4) is amended—

3 (1) by striking subsection (b) and inserting the
4 following new subsection:

5 "(b) MEMBERSHIP.—The Commission shall be composed of 18 members appointed by the Secretary for terms 6 7 of five years each. In appointing such members, the Sec-8 retary shall ensure that the interests of local, historic rec-9 reational users of the recreation area are represented."; and 10 (2) in subsection (q), by striking "cease to exist 11 thirty years after the enactment of this Act" and in-12 serting "terminate on December 31, 2014".

## 13 SEC. 203. MANZANAR NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE ADVISORY 14 COMMISSION.

15 Section 105(h) of Public Law 102–248 (16 U.S.C. 461
16 note) is amended by striking "10 years after the date of
17 enactment of this title" and inserting "on December 31,
18 2013".

Amend the title so as to read: "An Act to authorize the Secretary of the Interior to provide supplemental funding and other services that are necessary to assist certain local school districts in the State of California in providing educational services for students attending schools located within Yosemite National Park, to authorize the Secretary of the Interior to adjust the boundaries of the Golden Gate National Recreation Area, and for other purposes.".
