## A BILL

To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to acquire the McLoughlin House National Historic Site in Oregon City, Oregon, and to administer the site as a unit of the National Park System, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE; DEFINITIONS.**

4       (a) SHORT TITLE.—This Act may be cited as the  
5 “McLoughlin House National Historic Site Act”.

6       (b) DEFINITIONS.—For the purposes of this Act, the  
7 following definitions apply:

1           (1) ASSOCIATION.—The term “Association”  
2 means the McLoughlin Memorial Association, an or-  
3 ganization described in section 501(c)(3) of the In-  
4 ternal Revenue Code of 1986 and exempt from tax-  
5 ation under section 501(a) of such Code.

6           (2) CITY.—The term “City” means Oregon  
7 City, Oregon.

8           (3) HISTORIC SITE.—The term “Historic Site”  
9 means the McLoughlin House National Historic Site  
10 which is described in the Acting Assistant Secretary  
11 of the Interior’s Order of June 27, 1941, and gen-  
12 erally depicted on the map entitled “McLoughlin  
13 House National Historic Site”, numbered 007/  
14 80,000, and dated 12/01/01, and includes the  
15 McLoughlin House, the Barclay House, and other  
16 associated real property, improvements, and personal  
17 property.

18           (4) SECRETARY.—The term “Secretary” means  
19 the Secretary of the Interior.

20 **SEC. 2. FINDINGS.**

21 Congress finds the following:

22           (1) On June 27, 1941, Acting Assistant Sec-  
23 retary of the Interior W.C. Mendenhall, by means of  
24 the authority granted the Secretary under section 2  
25 of the Historic Sites Act of August 21, 1935, estab-

1 lished the McLoughlin Home National Historic Site,  
2 located in the City.

3 (2) Since January 16, 1945, the site has been  
4 known as McLoughlin House National Historic Site.

5 (3) The Historic Site includes the McLoughlin  
6 House and Barclay House, which are owned and  
7 managed by the Association.

8 (4) The Historic Site is located in a Charter  
9 Park on Oregon City Block 40, which is owned by  
10 the City.

11 (5) A cooperative agreement was made in 1941  
12 among the Association, the City, and the United  
13 States, providing for the preservation and use of the  
14 McLoughlin House as a national historic site.

15 (6) The Association has had an exemplary and  
16 longstanding role in the stewardship of the Historic  
17 Site but is unable to continue that role.

18 (7) The Historic Site has been an affiliated  
19 area of the National Park System and is worthy of  
20 recognition as part of the National Park System.

21 **SEC. 3. MCGLOUGHLIN HOUSE NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE.**

22 (a) ACQUISITION.—The Secretary is authorized to ac-  
23 quire the Historic Site, from willing sellers only, by dona-  
24 tion, purchase with donated or appropriated funds, or ex-

1 change, except that lands or interests in lands owned by  
2 the City may be acquired by donation only.

3 (b) BOUNDARIES; ADMINISTRATION.—Upon acquisi-  
4 tion of the Historic Site, the acquired property shall be  
5 included within the boundaries of, and be administered as  
6 part of, the Fort Vancouver National Historic Site in ac-  
7 cordance with all applicable laws and regulations of the  
8 National Park System.
