A BILL

- To direct the Secretary of Agriculture to convey certain land in the Lake Tahoe Basin Management Unit, Nevada, to the Secretary of the Interior, in trust for the Washoe Indian Tribe of Nevada and California.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. WASHOE TRIBE LAND CONVEYANCE.

- 4 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds that—
- 5 (1) the ancestral homeland of the Washoe Tribe
 6 of Nevada and California (referred to in this Act as
 7 the "Tribe") included an area of approximately
 8 5,000 square miles in and around Lake Tahoe, Cali-

1	fornia and Nevada, and Lake Tahoe was the heart
2	of the territory;
3	(2) in 1997, Federal, State, and local govern-
4	ments, together with many private landholders, rec-
5	ognized the Washoe people as indigenous people of
6	Lake Tahoe Basin through a series of meetings con-
7	vened by those governments at 2 locations in Lake
8	Tahoe;
9	(3) the meetings were held to address protec-
10	tion of the extraordinary natural, recreational, and
11	ecological resources in the Lake Tahoe region;
12	(4) the resulting multiagency agreement in-
13	cludes objectives that support the traditional and
14	customary uses of National Forest System land by
15	the Tribe; and
16	(5) those objectives include the provision of ac-
17	cess by members of the Tribe to the shore of Lake
18	Tahoe in order to reestablish traditional and cus-
19	tomary cultural practices.
20	(b) PURPOSES.—The purposes of this Act are—
21	(1) to implement the joint local, State, tribal,
22	and Federal objective of returning the Tribe to Lake
23	Tahoe; and
24	(2) to ensure that members of the Tribe have
25	the opportunity to engage in traditional and cus-

tomary cultural practices on the shore of Lake
 Tahoe to meet the needs of spiritual renewal, land
 stewardship, Washoe horticulture and ethnobotany,
 subsistence gathering, traditional learning, and re unification of tribal and family bonds.

6 (c) CONVEYANCE ON CONDITION SUBSEQUENT. 7 Subject to valid existing rights, the easement reserved 8 under subsection (d), and the condition stated in sub-9 section (e), the Secretary of Agriculture shall convey to 10 the Secretary of the Interior, in trust for the Tribe, for no consideration, all right, title, and interest in the parcel 11 of land comprising approximately 24.3 acres, located with-12 13 in the Lake Tahoe Basin Management Unit north of Skunk Harbor, Nevada, and more particularly described 14 15 as Mount Diablo Meridian, T15N, R18E, section 27, lot 3. 16

17 (d) EASEMENT.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—The conveyance under subsection (c) shall be made subject to reservation to
the United States of a nonexclusive easement for
public and administrative access over Forest Development Road #15N67 to National Forest System
land, to be administered by the Secretary of Agriculture.

1	(2) Access by individuals with disabil-
2	ITIES.—The Secretary of Agriculture shall provide a
3	reciprocal easement to the Tribe permitting vehic-
4	ular access to the parcel over Forest Development
5	Road #15N67 to—
6	(A) members of the Tribe for administra-
7	tive and safety purposes; and
8	(B) members of the Tribe who, due to age,
9	infirmity, or disability, would have difficulty ac-
10	cessing the conveyed parcel on foot.
11	(e) Condition on Use of Land.—
12	(1) IN GENERAL.—In using the parcel conveyed
13	under subsection (c), the Tribe and members of the
14	Tribe—
15	(A) shall limit the use of the parcel to tra-
16	ditional and customary uses and stewardship
17	conservation for the benefit of the Tribe;
18	(B) shall not permit any permanent resi-
19	dential or recreational development on, or com-
20	mercial use of, the parcel (including commercial
21	development, tourist accommodations, gaming,
22	sale of timber, or mineral extraction); and
23	(C) shall comply with environmental re-
24	quirements that are no less protective than en-
25	vironmental requirements that apply under the

Regional Plan of the Tahoe Regional Planning
 Agency.

3 TERMINATION AND REVERSION.—If the (2)4 Secretary of the Interior, after notice to the Tribe 5 and an opportunity for a hearing, based on monitoring of use of the parcel by the Tribe, makes a 6 finding that the Tribe has used or permitted the use 7 of the parcel in violation of paragraph (1) and the 8 9 Tribe fails to take corrective or remedial action directed by the Secretary of the Interior-10

(A) title to the parcel in the Secretary of
the Interior, in trust for the Tribe, shall terminate; and

14 (B) title to the parcel shall revert to the15 Secretary of Agriculture.
