5	(a) STUDY.—The Secretary of Education, in con-
6	sultation with the National Academy of Sciences, shall
7	conduct a study on methods for identifying and treating
8	children with dyslexia in kindergarten through third
9	grade. In carrying out the study, the Secretary shall con-
10	sider—
11	(1) whether there is a biological basis for dys-
12	lexia;
13	(2) whether dyslexia is caused by—
14	(A) a brain-based phonological deficit that
15	prevents an individual from breaking down
16	written words into component sounds;
17	(B) post-natal experience, including inad-
18	equate instruction; or
19	(C) a combination thereof; and
20	(3) the cost of implementing a program on a
21	nationwide basis to identify and treat children with
22	dyslexia in kindergarten through third grade.

23 (b) REPORT.—Not later than 120 days after the date24 of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Education

1 shall prepare and submit to Congress a report containing

2 the results of the study conducted under subsection (a).
