3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Veterans Outreach5 Protection Act".

1SEC. 2. RESCISSION OF DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AF-2FAIRS MEMORANDUM.

3 (a) Rescission of Memorandum.—The memorandum of the Department of Veterans Affairs dated July 4 5 18, 2002, from the Deputy Under Secretary for Health for Operations and Management with the subject "Status 6 7 of VHA Enrollment and Associated Issues" is hereby re-8 scinded. Marketing activities of Directors of health service networks (known as "Veterans Integrated Service Net-9 works") of the Department of Veterans Affairs to enroll 10 new veterans within their respective networks shall be car-11 ried out without regard to such memorandum. 12

(b) FUNDING LIMITATION.—No funds available to
the Department of Veterans Affairs may be used to carry
out the memorandum referred to in subsection (a) or otherwise to implement the policy contained in that memorandum.

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
