 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Aerial Firefighter Re-3 lief Act of 2003".

4 SEC. 2. DEATH AND DISABILITY BENEFITS FOR AERIAL
5 FIREFIGHTERS OF THE FOREST SERVICE
6 AND DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR AGEN7 CIES.

8 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds the following:

9 (1) Pilots and crew members of aircraft used to 10 fight wildfires generally work on a contract basis 11 with a State or Federal agency and, as a result, are 12 not eligible for death or disability benefits should 13 they be killed or injured in the line of duty.

14 (2) Employer death benefits and life insurance
15 for aerial firefighters are expensive, and the families
16 of these unsung heroes have to cope not only with
17 the loss of a loved one, but also the additional finan18 cial loss of a wage earner.

19 (3) It is vital that Congress continue to encour20 age the recruitment and retention of skilled and ex21 perienced aerial firefighters.

(b) ELIGIBILITY FOR DEATH AND DISABILITY BENEFITS.—Section 308 of the Federal Land Policy and Management Act of 1976 (43 U.S.C. 1738) is amended by
adding at the end the following new subsection:

"(c) ELIGIBILITY OF AERIAL FIREFIGHTERS FOR
 DEATH AND DISABILITY BENEFITS.—

3 "(1) ELIGIBILITY.—An individual who serves a 4 public agency specified in paragraph (2), or a con-5 tractor or subcontractor of such a public agency, in 6 an official capacity, with or without compensation, 7 as a pilot or a crew member of an aircraft carrying 8 out a firefighting mission on behalf of such public 9 agency and who is killed or disabled as a result of 10 an injury that occurs while the aircraft is moving 11 under its own power for the purpose of take off, 12 flight, or landing shall be eligible for a death or dis-13 ability benefit under section 1201 of Public Law 90-351 (42 U.S.C. 3796). 14

15 "(2) COVERED PUBLIC AGENCIES.—Subsection
16 (a) applies with respect to the Forest Service and
17 any agency of the Department of the Interior.

18 "(3) APPLICABILITY.—This subsection shall
19 apply with respect to death or injuries occurring on
20 or after September 29, 1976.".

21SEC. 3. ELIGIBILITY OF AERIAL FIREFIGHTERS FOR PUB-22LIC SAFETY OFFICER DEATH BENEFITS.

(a) IN GENERAL.—Paragraph (7) of section 1204 of
the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968
(42 U.S.C. 3796b) is amended—

(1) in subparagraph (B) by striking "or" at the
end;
(2) in subparagraph (C) by striking the period
at the end and inserting "; or"; and
(3) by adding at the end the following new sub-
paragraph:
"(D) an individual serving a public agency,
or a contractor or subcontractor at any tier of

8 or any tier of 9 a public agency, in an official capacity, with or without compensation, as a pilot or a crew 10 member of an aircraft carrying out a fire-11 fighting mission on behalf of such public agen-12 13 cy, so long as the injury occurs during the con-14 tract period beginning with the moment in 15 which the aircraft moves under its own power for the purpose of flight and ending with the 16 17 moment in which the aircraft comes to rest 18 after landing.".

(b) APPLICABILITY.—The amendments made by sub-19 20 section (a) shall apply with respect to injuries occurring 21 on or after September 29, 1976.

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
