A BILL

- To amend the Federal Meat Inspection Act and the Poultry Products Inspection Act to improve the safety of meat and poultry products.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Meat and Poultry
- 5 Products Traceability and Safety Act of 2003".

6 SEC. 2. TRACEABILITY OF LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY.

- 7 (a) LIVESTOCK.—Title I of the Federal Meat Inspec-
- 8 tion Act (21 U.S.C. 601 et seq.) is amended by adding
- 9 at the end the following:

3 "(a) DEFINITION OF TRACEABILITY.—In this sec4 tion, the term 'traceability' means the ability to retrieve
5 the history, use, and location of an article through a rec6 ordkeeping and audit system or registered identification.
7 "(b) REQUIREMENTS.—

8 "(1) IN GENERAL.—Cattle, sheep, swine, goats, 9 and horses, mules, and other equines presented for 10 slaughter for human food purposes, and the car-11 casses or parts of carcasses and the meat and meat 12 food products of those animals, shipped in interstate 13 commerce shall be identified in a manner that en-14 ables the Secretary to trace—

15 "(A) each animal to any premises or other
16 location at which the animal was held at any
17 time before slaughter; and

"(B) each carcass or part of a carcass and
meat and meat food product of such animals
forward from slaughter through processing and
distribution to the ultimate consumer.

"(2) TRACEABILITY SYSTEM.—The Secretary
shall establish a traceability system for all stages of
production, processing, and distribution of meat and
meat food products that are produced through the
slaughter of animals described in paragraph (1).

"(c) PROHIBITION OR RESTRICTION ON ENTRY.—
 The Secretary may prohibit or restrict entry into any
 slaughtering establishment inspected under this Act of any
 cattle, sheep, swine, goats, or horses, mules, or other
 equines not identified as prescribed by the Secretary under
 subsection (b).

7 "(d) Records.—

8 "(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary may require 9 that each person, firm, and corporation required to 10 identify livestock pursuant to subsection (b) main-11 tain accurate records, as prescribed by the Sec-12 retary, regarding the purchase, sale, and identifica-13 tion of the livestock.

"(2) ACCESS.—Each person, firm, and corporation described in paragraph (1) shall, at all reasonable times, on notice by a duly authorized representative of the Secretary, allow the representative to access to each place of business of the person, firm, or
corporation to examine and copy the records described in paragraph (1).

21 "(3) DURATION.—Each person, firm, and cor22 poration described in paragraph (1) shall maintain
23 records required to be maintained under this sub24 section for such period of time as the Secretary pre25 scribes.

"(e) FALSE INFORMATION.—No person, firm, or cor poration shall falsify or misrepresent to any other person,
 firm, or corporation, or to the Secretary, any information
 as to any premises at which any cattle, sheep, swine,
 goats, horses, mules, or other equines, or carcasses there of, were held.

7 "(f) ALTERATION OR DESTRUCTION OF RECORDS.— 8 No person, firm, or corporation shall, without authoriza-9 tion from the Secretary, alter, detach, or destroy any 10 records or other means of identification prescribed by the 11 Secretary for use in determining the premises at which 12 were held any cattle, sheep, swine, goats, horses, mules, 13 or other equines, or the carcasses thereof.".

(b) POULTRY.—The Poultry Products Inspection Act
is amended by inserting after section 23 (21 U.S.C. 467e)
the following:

17 "SEC. 23A. TRACEABILITY OF POULTRY AND POULTRY 18 PRODUCTS.

"(a) DEFINITION OF TRACEABILITY.—In this section, the term 'traceability' means the ability to retrieve
the history, use, and location of an article through a recordkeeping and audit system or registered identification.
"(b) REQUIREMENTS.—Poultry presented for slaughter for human food purposes and poultry products shipped

in interstate commerce shall be identified in a manner that
 enables the Secretary to trace—

3 "(A) each animal to any premises or other
4 location at which the animal was held at any
5 time before slaughter; and

6 "(B) each poultry product forward from
7 slaughter through processing and distribution
8 to the ultimate consumer.

"(2) TRACEABILITY SYSTEM.—The Secretary 9 10 shall establish a traceability system for all stages of 11 production, processing, and distribution of poultry 12 and poultry food products that are produced through 13 the slaughter of animals described in paragraph (1). 14 "(c) PROHIBITION OR RESTRICTION ON ENTRY.— 15 The Secretary may prohibit or restrict entry into any slaughtering establishment inspected under this Act of any 16 poultry not identified as prescribed by the Secretary. 17

18 "(d) Records.—

"(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary may require
that each person, firm, and corporation required to
identify poultry pursuant to subsection (b) maintain
accurate records, as prescribed by the Secretary, regarding the purchase, sale, and identification of the
poultry.

"(2) ACCESS.—Each person, firm, and corporation described in paragraph (1) shall, at all reasonable times, on notice by a duly authorized representative of the Secretary, allow the representative to access to each place of business of the person, firm, or
corporation to examine and copy the records described in paragraph (1).

8 "(3) DURATION.—Each person, firm, and cor-9 poration described in paragraph (1) shall maintain 10 records required to be maintained under this sub-11 section for such period of time as the Secretary pre-12 scribes.

"(e) FALSE INFORMATION.—No person, firm, or corporation shall falsify or misrepresent to any other person,
firm, or corporation, or to the Secretary, any information
as to any premises at which any poultry, or carcasses
thereof, were held.

18 "(f) ALTERATION OR DESTRUCTION OF RECORDS.—
19 No person, firm, or corporation shall, without authoriza20 tion from the Secretary, alter, detach, or destroy any
21 records or other means of identification prescribed by the
22 Secretary for use in determining the premises at which
23 were held any poultry or the carcasses thereof.".

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
