  - 3 SECTION 1. IDENTIFICATION OF KEY RESOURCES.
  - 4 Section 201 of the Homeland Security Act of 2002
  - 5 (Public Law 107–296) is amended by adding at the end
  - 6 the following:
  - 7 "(i) Definition.—In this section, the term 'key re-
- 8 sources' includes National Park Service sites identified by

1	the Secretary of the Interior as being so universally recog-
2	nized as symbols of the United States and so heavily vis-
3	ited by the American and international public that such
4	sites would likely be identified as targets of terrorist at-
5	tacks, including—
6	"(1) the Statue of Liberty National Monument
7	in New York Harbor;
8	"(2) Independence Hall and the Liberty Bell in
9	Philadelphia, Pennsylvania;
10	"(3) the Gateway Arch in St. Louis, Missouri;
11	"(4) Mount Rushmore National Memorial in
12	Keystone, South Dakota; and
13	"(5) memorials and monuments in the District
14	of Columbia.".
