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## AN ACT

To establish the Kate Mullany National Historic Site in  
the State of New York, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Kate Mullany National  
5 Historic Site Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.**

2 In this Act:

3 (1) CENTER.—The term “Center” means the  
4 American Labor Studies Center.

5 (2) HISTORIC SITE.—The term “historic site”  
6 means the Kate Mullany National Historic Site es-  
7 tablished by section 3(a).

8 (3) SECRETARY.—The term “Secretary” means  
9 the Secretary of the Interior.

10 **SEC. 3. KATE MULLANY NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE.**

11 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—

12 (1) IN GENERAL.—There is established as an  
13 affiliated area of the National Park System the Kate  
14 Mullany National Historic Site in the State of New  
15 York.

16 (2) COMPONENTS.—The historic site shall con-  
17 sist of the home of Kate Mullany, located at 350  
18 Eighth Street in Troy, New York.

19 (b) ADMINISTRATION.—

20 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Center shall own, ad-  
21 minister, and operate the historic site.

22 (2) APPLICABILITY OF NATIONAL PARK SYSTEM  
23 LAWS.—The historic site shall be administered in ac-  
24 cordance with—

25 (A) this Act; and

1 (B) the laws generally applicable to units  
2 of the National Park System, including—

3 (i) the Act of August 25, 1916 (com-  
4 monly known as the “National Park Serv-  
5 ice Organic Act”) (16 U.S.C. 1 et seq.);  
6 and

7 (ii) the Act of August 21, 1935 (16  
8 U.S.C. 461 et seq.).

9 (c) COOPERATIVE AGREEMENTS.—(1) The Secretary  
10 may enter into cooperative agreements with the Center  
11 under which the Secretary may provide to the Center tech-  
12 nical, planning, interpretive, construction, and preserva-  
13 tion assistance for—

14 (A) the preservation of the historic site; and

15 (B) educational, interpretive, and research ac-  
16 tivities relating to the historic site and any related  
17 sites.

18 (2) The Secretary may provide to the Center financial  
19 assistance in an amount equal to not more than \$500,000  
20 to assist the Center in acquiring from a willing seller the  
21 structure adjacent to the historic site, located at 350  
22 Eighth Street in Troy, New York. On acquisition of the  
23 structure, the Secretary shall revise the boundary of the  
24 historic site to reflect the acquisition. The non-Federal

1 share of the total cost of acquiring the structure shall be  
 2 at least 50 percent.

3 (d) GENERAL MANAGEMENT PLAN.—

4 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 3 full fiscal  
 5 years after the date on which funds are made avail-  
 6 able to carry out this Act, the Secretary, in coopera-  
 7 tion with the Center, shall develop a general man-  
 8 agement plan for the historic site.

9 (2) CONTENTS.—The general management plan  
 10 shall define the role and responsibilities of the Sec-  
 11 retary with respect to the interpretation and preser-  
 12 vation of the historic site.

13 (3) APPLICABLE LAW.—The general manage-  
 14 ment plan shall be prepared in accordance with sec-  
 15 tion 12(b) of the Act of August 18, 1970 (16 U.S.C.  
 16 1a–7(b)).

17 **SEC. 4. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.**

18 There are authorized to be appropriated such sums  
 19 as are necessary to carry out this Act.
