# A BILL

To establish the Kate Mullany National Historic Site in the State of New York, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

## 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be eited as the "Kate Mullany National

5 Historie Site Act".

# 1 SEC. 2. FINDINGS AND PURPOSES.

2	(a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds that—
3	(1) the Kate Mullany House in Troy, New
4	York, is listed on the National Register of Historic
5	Places and has been designated as a National His-
6	toric Landmark;
7	(2) the National Historic Landmark Theme
8	Study on American Labor History concluded that
9	the Kate Mullany House appears to meet the criteria
10	of national significance, suitability, and feasibility
11	for inclusion in the National Park System;
12	(3) the city of Troy, New York—
13	(A) played an important role in the devel-
14	opment of the collar and cuff industry and the
15	iron industry in the 19th century, and in the
16	development of early men's and women's worker
17	and cooperative organizations; and
18	(B) was the home of the first women's
19	labor union, led by Irish immigrant Kate
20	Mullany;
21	(4) the city of Troy, New York, has entered
22	into a cooperative arrangement with 6 neighboring
23	cities, towns, and villages to create the Hudson-Mo-
24	hawk Urban Cultural Park Commission to manage
25	the valuable historic resources in the area, and the
26	area within those municipalities has been designated

1	by the State of New York as a heritage area to rep-
2	resent industrial development and labor themes in
3	the development of the State;
4	(5) the area, known as the "Hudson-Mohawk
5	Urban Cultural Park" or "RiverSpark", has been a
6	pioneer in the development of partnership parks in
7	which intergovernmental and public and private
8	partnerships bring about the conservation of the
9	area's heritage and the attainment of goals for pres-
10	ervation, education, recreation, and economic devel-
11	opment; and
12	(6) establishment of the Kate Mullany National
13	Historic Site and cooperative efforts between the
14	National Park Service and the Hudson-Mohawk
15	Urban Cultural Park Commission will—
16	$(\Lambda)$ provide opportunities for the illustra-
17	tion and interpretation of important themes of
18	the heritage of the United States; and
19	(B) provide unique opportunities for edu-
20	cation, public use, and enjoyment.
21	(b) PURPOSES.—The purposes of this Act are—
22	(1) to preserve and interpret the nationally sig-
23	nificant home of Kate Mullany for the benefit, inspi-
24	ration, and education of the people of the United
25	States; and

1	(2) to interpret the connection between immi-
2	gration and the industrialization of the United
3	States (including the history of Irish immigration,
4	women's history, and worker history).
5	SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS.
6	In this Act:
7	(1) HISTORIC SITE.—The term "historic site"
8	means the Kate Mullany National Historic Site es-
9	tablished by section 4.
10	(2) PLAN.—The term "plan" means the general
11	management plan developed under section $6(d)$ .
12	(3) SECRETARY.—The term "Secretary" means
13	the Secretary of the Interior.
14	SEC. 4. ESTABLISHMENT OF KATE MULLANY NATIONAL
15	HISTORIC SITE.
16	(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is established as a unit
17	of the National Park System the Kate Mullany National
18	Historic Site in the State of New York.
19	(b) Description.—The historic site shall consist of
20	the home of Kate Mullany, comprising approximately
21	.05739 acre, located at 350 Eighth Street in Troy, New
22	York, as generally depicted on the map entitled
23	<del>and dated</del> <del>.</del>

#### 1 SEC. 5. ACQUISITION OF PROPERTY.

2 (a) REAL PROPERTY.—The Secretary may acquire 3 land and interests in land within the boundaries of the 4 historic site and ancillary real property for parking or in-5 terpretation, as necessary and appropriate for manage-6 ment of the historic site.

7 (b) PERSONAL PROPERTY.—The Secretary may ac8 quire personal property associated with, and appropriate
9 for, the interpretation of the historic site.

10 (c) MEANS.—An acquisition of real property or per11 sonal property may be made by donation, purchase from
12 a willing seller with donated or appropriated funds, or ex13 change.

#### 14 SEC. 6. ADMINISTRATION OF HISTORIC SITE.

(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall administer
the historic site in accordance with this Act and the law
generally applicable to units of the National Park System,
including—

 (1) the Act of August 25, 1916 (16 U.S.C. 1

 et seq.); and

21 (2) the Act of August 21, 1935 (16 U.S.C. 461
22 et seq.).

23 (b) COOPERATIVE AGREEMENTS. In carrying out
24 this Act, the Secretary may consult with and enter into
25 cooperative agreements with the State of New York, the
26 Hudson-Mohawk Urban Cultural Park Commission, and

other public and private entities to facilitate public under standing and enjoyment of the life and work of Kate
 Mullany through the development, presentation, and fund ing of exhibits and other appropriate activities related to
 the preservation, interpretation, and use of the historie
 site and related historic resources.

7 (c) EXHIBITS.—The Secretary may display, and ac8 cept for the purposes of display, items associated with
9 Kate Mullany, as may be necessary for the interpretation
10 of the historic site.

11 (d) GENERAL MANAGEMENT PLAN.—

12 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 2 full fiscal
13 years after the date of enactment of this Act, the
14 Secretary shall—

15 (A) develop a general management plan for
16 the historic site; and

17 (B) submit the plan to the Committee on
18 Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate
19 and the Committee on Resources of the House
20 of Representatives.

21 (2) CONTENTS.—The plan shall include rec22 ommendations for regional wayside exhibits to be
23 carried out through cooperative agreements with the
24 State of New York and other public and private en25 tities.

1	(3) Requirements.—The plan shall be pre-
2	pared in accordance with section 12(b) of the Act of
3	August 18, 1970 (16 U.S.C. 1a-7(b)).
4	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
5	This Act may be cited as the "Kate Mullany National
6	Historic Site Act".
7	SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.
8	In this Act:
9	(1) CENTER.—The term "Center" means the
10	American Labor Studies Center.
11	(2) HISTORIC SITE.—The term "historic site"
12	means the Kate Mullany National Historic Site estab-
13	lished by section $3(a)$ .
14	(3) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
15	the Secretary of the Interior.
16	SEC. 3. KATE MULLANY NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE.
17	(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—
18	(1) IN GENERAL.—There is established as an af-
19	filiated area of the National Park System the Kate
20	Mullany National Historic Site in the State of New
21	York.
22	(2) Components.—The historic site shall consist
23	of the home of Kate Mullany, located at 350 Eighth
24	Street in Troy, New York.
25	(b) Administration.—

1	(1) IN GENERAL.—The Center shall own, admin-
2	ister, and operate the historic site.
3	(2) Applicability of national park system
4	LAWS.—The historic site shall be administered in ac-
5	cordance with—
6	(A) this Act; and
7	(B) the laws generally applicable to units of
8	the National Park System, including—
9	(i) the Act of August 25, 1916 (com-
10	monly known as the "National Park Service
11	Organic Act") (16 U.S.C. 1 et seq.); and
12	( <i>ii</i> ) the Act of August 21, 1935 (16
13	U.S.C. 461 et seq.).
14	(c) Cooperative Agreements.—(1) The Secretary
15	may enter into cooperative agreements with the Center
16	under which the Secretary may provide to the Center tech-
17	nical, planning, interpretive, construction, and preserva-
18	tion assistance for—
19	(A) the preservation of the historic site; and
20	(B) educational, interpretive, and research ac-
21	tivities relating to the historic site and any related
22	sites.
23	(2) The Secretary may provide to the Center financial
24	assistance in an amount equal to not more than \$500,000
25	to assist the Center in acquiring from a willing seller the

structure adjacent to the historic site, located at 352 Eighth
 Street in Troy, New York. On acquisition of the structure,
 the Secretary shall revise the boundary of the historic site
 to reflect the acquisition. The non-Federal share of the total
 cost of acquiring the structure shall be at least 50 percent.

6 (d) GENERAL MANAGEMENT PLAN.—

7 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 3 full fiscal
8 years after the date on which funds are made avail9 able to carry out this Act, the Secretary, in coopera10 tion with the Center, shall develop a general manage11 ment plan for the historic site.

(2) CONTENTS.—The general management plan
shall define the role and responsibilities of the Secretary with respect to the interpretation and preservation of the historic site.

16 (3) APPLICABLE LAW.—The general management
17 plan shall be prepared in accordance with section
18 12(b) of the Act of August 18, 1970 (16 U.S.C. 1a–
19 7(b)).

## 20 SEC. 4. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

There are authorized to be appropriated such sums as
are necessary to carry out this Act.
