Ms. MURKOWSKI introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources

A BILL

To direct the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a study of the Baranov Museum in Kodiak, Alaska, for potential inclusion in the National Park System.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Baranov Museum
5 Study Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. STUDY AND REPORT.**

7 (a) **STUDY.**—The Secretary of the Interior (referred
8 to in this Act as the “Secretary”) shall conduct a study
9 of the Baranov Museum in Kodiak, Alaska, to determine

1 the suitability and feasibility of designating the museum
2 as a unit of the National Park System.

3 (b) CRITERIA.—In conducting the study under sub-
4 section (a), the Secretary shall use the criteria for the
5 study of areas for potential inclusion in the National Park
6 System under section 8 of Public Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C.
7 1a–5).

8 (c) REPORT.—Not later than 1 year after the date
9 of enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall submit to
10 the Committee on Resources of the House of Representa-
11 tives and the Committee on Energy and Natural Re-
12 sources of the Senate a report that describes—

13 (1) the findings of the study; and

14 (2) any conclusions and recommendations of the
15 Secretary.

16 (d) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
17 are authorized to be appropriated such sums as are nec-
18 essary to carry out this Act.
