## A BILL

To promote effective enforcement of copyrights, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION. 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Enhancing Federal
- 5 Obscenity Reporting and Copyright Enforcement Act of
- 6 2003".
- 7 SEC. 2. HARMLESS ERRORS IN REGISTRATION CERTIFI-
- 8 CATES.
- 9 (a) In General.—Section 411 of title 17, United
- 10 States Code, is amended—

- 1 (1) by redesignating subsection (b) as sub-2 section (c); and
- 3 (2) inserting after subsection (a) the following:
- 4 "(b)(1) A certificate of registration shall satisfy the
- 5 requirements of this section and section 412 irrespective
- 6 of any inaccurate information therein, unless—
- 7 "(A) the inaccurate information was included
- 8 on the application for copyright registration with
- 9 knowledge that it was inaccurate; and
- 10 "(B) the inaccurate information, if known,
- 11 would have caused the Register of Copyrights to
- refuse registration.
- 13 "(2) In any case in which inaccuracies described
- 14 under paragraph (1) are alleged, the court shall request
- 15 the Register of Copyrights to advise the court whether the
- 16 inaccurate information, if known, would have caused the
- 17 Register of Copyrights to refuse registration.".
- 18 (b) Technical and Conforming Amendment.—
- 19 Section 412 of title 17, United States Code, is amended
- 20 by striking "section 411(b)" and inserting "section
- 21 411(c)".
- 22 SEC. 3. COMPUTATION OF STATUTORY DAMAGES.
- Section 504(c)(1) of title 17, United States Code, is
- 24 amended in the second sentence by inserting before the
- 25 period ", except that the court in its discretion may deter-

1	mine that such parts are separate works if the court con-
2	cludes that they are distinct works having independent
3	economic value".
4	SEC. 4. MECHANICAL LICENSE NEGOTIATIONS FOR PHYS
5	ICAL PRODUCT CONFIGURATIONS.
6	Section 115(c)(3)(B) of title 17, United States Code
7	is amended in the first sentence by striking "under this
8	paragraph" and inserting "under this section".
9	SEC. 5. REPORT TO CONGRESS.
10	The Attorney General shall include in the report of
11	the Attorney General to Congress on the business of the
12	Department of Justice, prepared under section 522 of title
13	28, United States Code, the number of misdemeanor pros-
14	ecutions and the number of felony prosecutions under sec-
15	tions 2252, 2252A, 2252B, 2260, 2318, 2319, 2319A
16	and 2320 of title 18, United States Code, commenced and
17	concluded during the last preceding fiscal year, including
18	in the case of those offenses where applicable, detailed in-
19	formation concerning—
20	(1) the types of works involved;
21	(2) the tangible media of expression and means
22	of reproduction and distribution involved; and
23	(3) in the case of prosecutions concluded, the

disposition of such prosecutions, such as the number

- 1 of convictions and acquittals, and the sentences im-
- 2 posed.
- 3 SEC. 6. INVESTIGATION OF INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY
- 4 CRIMES.
- 5 (a) REQUIRED STAFFING.—The Attorney General
- 6 shall ensure that any unit in the Department of Justice
- 7 responsible for investigating computer hacking or respon-
- 8 sible for investigating intellectual property crimes is as-
- 9 signed at least 1 agent to support such unit for the pur-
- 10 pose of investigating crimes relating to the theft of intel-
- 11 lectual property and that each such agent has received
- 12 training in the investigation and enforcement of intellec-
- 13 tual property crimes.
- 14 (b) Authorization of Appropriations.—There
- 15 are authorized to be appropriated to the Department of
- 16 Justice \$5,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2005, 2006,
- 17 2007, 2008, and 2009 to carry out the requirements of
- 18 subsection (a).
