## **AN ACT**

For the relief of Luay Lufti Hadad.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

## 1SECTION 1. PERMANENT RESIDENT STATUS FOR LUAY2LUFTI HADAD.

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding subsections (a) and (b) of section 201 of the Immigration and Nationality 4 5 Act, Luay Lufti Hadad shall be eligible for issuance of an immigrant visa or for adjustment of status to that of 6 7 an alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence upon 8 filing an application for issuance of an immigrant visa 9 under section 204 of that Act or for adjustment of status 10 to lawful permanent resident.

(b) ADJUSTMENT OF STATUS.—If Luay Lufti Hadad
enters the United States before the filing deadline specified in subsection (c), Luay Lufti Hadad shall be considered to have entered and remained lawfully and shall be
eligible for adjustment of status under section 245 of the
Immigration and Nationality Act as of the date of enactment of this Act.

18 (c) DEADLINE FOR APPLICATION AND PAYMENT OF 19 FEES.—Subsections (a) and (b) shall apply only if the ap-20 plication for issuance of an immigrant visa or the application for adjustment of status is filed with appropriate fees 21 22 within 2 years after the date of enactment of this Act. 23 (d) REDUCTION OF IMMIGRANT VISA NUMBERS.— 24 Upon the granting of an immigrant visa or permanent residence to Luay Lufti Hadad, the Secretary of State shall 25 26 instruct the proper officer to reduce by 1, during the cur-S 2012 RFH

rent or next following fiscal year, the total number of im migrant visas that are made available to natives of the
 country of birth of Luay Lufti Hadad under section
 203(a) of the Immigration and Nationality Act or, if appli cable, the total number of immigrant visas that are made
 available to natives of the country of birth of Luay Lufti
 Hadad under section 202(e) of that Act.
