A BILL

To limit Department of Defense contracting with firms under investigation by the Inspector General of the Department of Defense.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 2 3 SECTION 1. LIMITATION ON DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE 4 CONTRACTING WITH FIRMS UNDER INVES-5 TIGATION BY THE INSPECTOR GENERAL OF 6 THE DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE. 7 (a) LIMITATION.—No official of the Department of 8 Defense may enter into a contract with, or otherwise procure any property or services from, a person while such 9 10 person is under investigation by the Inspector General of the Department of Defense, unless the selection of such
 person for such contract or other procurement is made
 with full and open competition.

4 (b) WAIVER AUTHORITY.—

5 (1) AUTHORITY.—The President may waive the 6 applicability of subsection (a) to a person in the case 7 of any contract or other procurement of the Depart-8 ment of Defense if the President determines that it 9 is necessary to enter into such contract or other pro-10 curement with such person in the national security 11 interests of the United States.

12 (2) NOTIFICATION REQUIREMENT.—Not later 13 than 15 days before granting a waiver under para-14 graph (1), the President shall transmit a notification 15 of the waiver to Congress. The notification shall in-16 clude a description of the procurement to which the 17 waiver relates, the person from whom the procure-18 ment is to be made, and the justification for grant-19 ing the waiver.

(c) FULL AND OPEN COMPETITION DEFINED.—In
this section, the term "full and open competition" has the
meaning given such term in section 4 of the Office of Federal Procurement Policy Act (41 U.S.C. 403).

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
