A BILL

To open certain withdrawn land in Big Horn County, Wyoming, to locatable mineral development for bentonite mining.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. OPENING OF CERTAIN WITHDRAWN LAND IN
- 4 WYOMING TO LOCATABLE MINERAL DEVEL-
- 5 OPMENT FOR BENTONITE MINING.
- 6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provi-
- 7 sion of law and subject to subsection (c), the land de-
- 8 scribed in subsection (b) shall be open to locatable mineral
- 9 development for bentonite mining.

- 1 (b) COVERED LAND.—The land referred to in sub-
- 2 section (a) is approximately 40 acres of previously with-
- 3 drawn land located in Big Horn County, Wyoming, at the
- 4 sixth principal meridian, T. 56 N., R. 95 W., Sec. 32.
- 5 E½E½SE¼, adjacent to Pit No. 144L covered by State
- 6 of Wyoming Mining Permit No. 321C.
- 7 (c) CLOSURE.—The Secretary of the Army may close
- 8 the land opened by subsection (a) at any time if the Sec-
- 9 retary determines that the closure of the land is required
- 10 by reason of a national emergency or for the purpose of
- 11 national defense or security.
