3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Continuity of the Sen-5 ate Act of 2004".

SEC. 2. INCAPACITIES IN THE SENATE FOLLOWING A CATA STROPHIC INCIDENT.

(a) IN GENERAL.—In the event that the Senate ascertains that a quorum of the Senate is not present, the
Majority Leader and Minority Leader of the Senate, or
their designees, may jointly determine that such absence
of a quorum is caused by the inability of the members
of the Senate to discharge the powers and duties of the
office during a time of national crisis.

(b) STATE LAWS.—The legislature of each State may
enact such laws as the State determines necessary declaring who shall serve in the place of members that are determined to be unable to discharge the powers and duties
of the office under subsection (a).

15 SEC. 3. LIMITATION.

16 Nothing in this Act shall limit the authority of any17 State under the Constitution of the United States to fill18 a vacancy in the Senate.
