A BILL

To establish the Lewis and Clark National Historical Park in the States of Washington and Oregon, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- This Act may be cited as the "Lewis and Clark Na-
- 3 tional Historical Park Act of 2004".
- 4 SEC. 2. PURPOSE.
- 5 The purpose of this Act is to establish the Lewis and
- 6 Clark National Historical Park to—
- 7 (1) preserve for the benefit of the people of the
- 8 United States the historic, cultural, scenic, and nat-
- 9 ural resources associated with the arrival of the
- 10 Lewis and Clark Expedition in the lower Columbia
- 11 River area; and
- 12 (2) commemorate the winter encampment of
- the Lewis and Clark Expedition in the winter of
- 14 1805–1806 following the successful crossing of the
- North American Continent.
- 16 SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS.
- 17 In this Act:
- 18 (1) MAP.—The term "map" means the map en-
- 19 titled "Lewis and Clark National Historical Park,
- Boundary Map", numbered 405/80027, and dated
- 21 December, 2003.
- 22 (2) Memorial.—The term "Memorial" means
- 23 the Fort Clatsop National Memorial established
- under section 1 of Public Law 85–435 (16 U.S.C.
- 25 450mm).

1	(3) PARK.—The term "Park" means the Lewis				
2	and Clark National Historical Park established by				
3	section 4(a).				
4	(4) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means				
5	the Secretary of the Interior.				
6	SEC. 4. LEWIS AND CLARK NATIONAL HISTORICAL PARK.				
7	(a) Establishment.—There is established as a unit				
8	of the National Park System the Lewis and Clark Na-				
9	tional Historical Park in the States of Washington and				
10	Oregon, as depicted on the map.				
11	(b) Components.—The Park shall consist of—				
12	(1) the Memorial, including—				
13	(A) the site of the salt cairn (lot number				
14	18, block 1, Cartwright Park Addition of Sea-				
15	side, Oregon) used by the Lewis and Clark Ex-				
16	pedition; and				
17	(B) portions of the trail used by the Lewis				
18	and Clark Expedition that led overland from				
19	Fort Clatsop to the Pacific Ocean;				
20	(2) the parcels of land identified on the map as				
21	"Fort Clatsop 2002 Addition Lands"; and				
22	(3) the parcels of land located along the lower				
23	Columbia River in the State of Washington that are				
24	associated with the arrival of the Lewis and Clark				

1	Expedition at the Pacific Ocean in 1805 and that
2	are identified on the map as—
3	(A) "Station Camp";
4	(B) "Clark's Dismal Nitch"; and
5	(C) "Memorial to Thomas Jefferson".
6	(C) "Cape Disappointment".
7	(c) AVAILABILITY OF MAP.—The map shall be on file
8	and available for public inspection in the appropriate of-
9	fices of the National Park Service.
10	(d) Acquisition of Land.—
11	(1) In general.—The Secretary may acquire
12	land, an interest in land, and any improvements to
13	land located within the boundary of the Park.
14	(2) Means.—Subject to paragraph (3), an ac-
15	quisition of land under paragraph (1) may be made
16	by donation, purchase with donated or appropriated
17	funds, exchange, transfer from any Federal agency,
18	or by any other means that the Secretary determines
19	to be in the public interest.
20	(3) Consent of owner.—
21	(A) In general.—Except as provided in
22	subparagraph (B), no land, interest in land, or
23	improvement to land to may be acquired under
24	paragraph (1) without the consent of the owner.

1	(B) Exception.—The corporately-owned
2	timberland in the area described in subsection
3	(b)(2) may be acquired without the consent of
4	the owner.

(4) Memorandum of understanding.—If the owner of the timberland described in paragraph (2)(B) agrees to sell the timberland to the Secretary either as a result of a condemnation proceeding or without any condemnation proceeding, the Secretary shall enter into a memorandum of understanding with the owner with respect to the manner in which the timberland is to be managed after acquisition of the timberland by the Secretary.

(5) ACQUISITION OF ADDITIONAL LAND.—

(A) IN GENERAL.—In addition to the land authorized to be acquired under paragraph (1), the National Park Service is authorized to acquire by transfer Federal land at Cape Disappointment, Washington.

(B) Management.—The National Park Service shall enter into a cooperative management agreement with the State of Washington under section 5(e) to provide for the management of the land acquired under subparagraph (A) as a State park.

1	(5) Cape disappointment.—
2	(A) Transfer.—
3	(i) In general.—Subject to valid
4	rights (including withdrawals), the Sec-
5	retary shall transfer to the Director of the
6	National Park Service management of any
7	Federal land at Cape Disappointment,
8	Washington, that is within the boundary of
9	the Park.
10	(ii) Withdrawn Land.—
11	(I) Notice.—The head of any
12	Federal agency that has administrative
13	jurisdiction over withdrawn land at
14	Cape Disappointment, Washington,
15	within the boundary of the Park shall
16	notify the Secretary in writing if the
17	head of the Federal agency does not
18	need the withdrawn land.
19	(II) Transfer.—On receipt of a
20	notice under subclause (I), the with-
21	drawn land shall be transferred to the
22	administrative jurisdiction of the Sec-
23	retary, to be administered as part of
24	the Park.
25	(B) Memorial to thomas jefferson.—

1	(i) In general.—All withdrawals of
2	the 20-acre parcel depicted on the map as
3	"Memorial to Thomas Jefferson" are re-
4	voked.
5	(ii) Establishment.—The Secretary
6	shall establish a memorial to Thomas Jeffer-
7	son on the parcel referred to in clause (i).
8	(C) Management of cape disappoint-
9	MENT STATE PARK LAND.—The Secretary may
10	enter into an agreement with the State of Wash-
11	ington providing for the administration by the
12	State of the land within the boundary of the
13	Park known as "Cape Disappointment State
14	Park".
15	SEC. 5. ADMINISTRATION.
16	(a) In General.—The Secretary shall administer
17	the Park in accordance with—
18	(1) this Act; and
19	(2) the laws generally applicable to units of the
20	National Park System, including—
21	(A) the Act of August 25, 1916 (16 U.S.C.
22	1 et seq.); and
23	(B) the Act of August 21, 1935 (16 U.S.C.
24	461 et seq.).

- 1 (b) Management Plan.—Not later than 3 years
- 2 after funds are made available to carry out this Act, the
- 3 Secretary shall prepare an amendment to the general
- 4 management plan for the Memorial to address the man-
- 5 agement of the Park.
- 6 (c) Cooperative Management Agreements.—To
- 7 facilitate the presentation of a comprehensive picture of
- 8 the experiences of the Lewis and Clark Expedition in the
- 9 lower Columbia River area and to promote more efficient
- 10 administration of the sites associated with those experi-
- 11 ences, the Secretary may, in accordance with section 3(1)
- 12 of Public Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C. 1a–2(l)), enter into co-
- 13 operative management agreements with appropriate offi-
- 14 cials in the States of Washington and Oregon.
- 15 SEC. 6. REPEALS; REFERENCES.
- 16 (a) In General.—Public Law 85–435 (72 Stat.
- 17 153; 16 U.S.C. 450mm et seq.) is repealed.
- 18 (b) References.—Any reference to Fort Clatsop
- 19 National Memorial in a law (including regulations), map,
- 20 document, paper, or other record shall be considered to
- 21 be a reference to the Lewis and Clark National Historical
- 22 Park.
- 23 SEC. 7. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.
- There are authorized to be appropriated such sums
- 25 as are necessary to carry out this Act.

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
