## AN ACT

To amend section 29(k) of the Small Business Act to establish funding priorities for women's business centers.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Women's Sustain-
- 5 ability Recovery Act of 2004".

## 1 SEC. 2. WOMEN'S BUSINESS CENTERS.

2	(a) In General.—Section 29(k) of the Small Busi-
3	ness Act (15 U.S.C. 656(k)) is amended—
4	(1) in paragraph (2), by adding at the end the
5	following:
6	"(C) Funding priority.—Subject to
7	available funds, and reservation of funds, the
8	Administration shall, for fiscal year 2004, allo-
9	cate—
10	"(i) \$150,000 for each eligible wom-
11	en's business center established under sub-
12	section (b), except for centers that request
13	a lesser amount;
14	"(ii) from the funds reserved under
15	paragraph (4)(A), not more than \$125,000
16	to each eligible women's business center es-
17	tablished under subsection (l); and
18	"(iii) any funds remaining after allo-
19	cations are made under clauses (i) and (ii)
20	to new eligible women's business centers
21	and eligible women's business centers that
22	did not receive funding in the prior fiscal
23	year under subsection (b)."; and
24	(2) in paragraph (4)(A), by adding at the end
25	the following:

"(v) For fiscal year 2004, 48 percent.".

(b) SUNSET DATE.—The amendments made by subsection (a) are repealed on October 1, 2004.
