3 SECTION 1. UPPER MISSOURI RIVER WATER STORAGE.

4 (a) WATER STORAGE.—Notwithstanding any project
5 or activity carried out by the Secretary of the Army, acting
6 through the Chief of Engineers, under the Pick-Sloan Mis7 souri River Basin Program authorized by section 9 of the
8 Act of December 22, 1944 (58 Stat. 891), or any other

law, the Secretary shall cease to support water releases
 for navigation purposes at any time at which the total vol ume of water stored in the reservoirs described in sub section (b) is less than 44,000,000 acre-feet.

5 (b) RESERVOIRS.—The reservoirs referred to in sub6 section (a) are the following reservoirs located in the vicin7 ity of the upper portion of the Missouri River:

8 (1) Fort Peck Lake.

9 (2) Lake Sakakawea.

- 10 (3) Lake Oahe.
- 11 (4) Lake Sharpe.
- 12 (5) Lake Francis Case.
- 13 (6) Lewis and Clark Lake.
