 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Assistance to Fire-3 fighters Act of 2004".

4 SEC. 2. AUTHORITY OF SECRETARY OF HOMELAND SECU5 RITY FOR FIREFIGHTER ASSISTANCE PRO6 GRAM.

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subsection (b)(1) of section 33 of
8 the Federal Fire Prevention and Control Act of 1974 (15
9 U.S.C. 2229) is amended by striking "Director" in the
10 matter preceding subparagraph (A) and inserting "Sec11 retary of Homeland Security, in consultation with the Ad12 ministrator,".

(b) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—Such section is further amended by striking "Director" each place it appears
and inserting "Secretary of Homeland Security".

16 (c) TECHNICAL AMENDMENT.—The heading of sub17 section (b)(8) of such section is amended by striking "DI18 RECTOR" and inserting "SECRETARY".

19SEC. 3. GRANTS TO VOLUNTEER EMERGENCY MEDICAL20SERVICE ORGANIZATIONS.

(a) AUTHORITY TO AWARD GRANTS TO VOLUNTEER
EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE SQUADS.—Paragraph
(1)(A) of section 33(b) of the Federal Fire Prevention and
Control Act of 1974 (15 U.S.C. 2229(b)) is amended by
inserting "or to volunteer emergency medical service organizations" after "fire departments".

(b) USE OF GRANT FUNDS.—Paragraph (3)(F) of
 such section is amended by inserting "or volunteer emer gency medical service organizations that are not affiliated
 with a for-profit entity" after "fire departments".

5 (c) SPECIAL RULE FOR APPLICATIONS FOR VOLUN6 TEER EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES.—Paragraph (5)
7 of such section is amended by adding at the end, the fol8 lowing new subparagraph:

9 "(C) SPECIAL RULE FOR VOLUNTEER 10 EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES.—The Sec-11 retary of Homeland Security shall permit an 12 applicant seeking grant funds for volunteer 13 emergency medical services under paragraph 14 (3)(F) to use the same application form to seek 15 grant funds for one or more of the other pur-16 poses set out in subparagraphs (A) through (O) 17 of paragraph (3).".

18 SEC.4.GRANTSFORAUTOMATEDEXTERNAL19DEFIBRILLATOR DEVICES.

20 Paragraph (3) of section 33(b) of the Federal Fire
21 Prevention and Control Act of 1974 (15 U.S.C. 2229(b))
22 is amended by adding at the end the following new sub23 paragraph:

24 "(O) To obtain automated external
25 defibrillator devices.".

1	SEC. 5. CRITERIA FOR REVIEWING GRANT APPLICATIONS.
2	Paragraph (2) of section 33(b) of the Federal Fire
3	Prevention and Control Act of 1974 (15 U.S.C. 2229(b))
4	is amended to read as follows:
5	"(2) CRITERIA AND REVIEW OF APPLICA-
6	TIONS.—
7	"(A) PRELIMINARY REVIEW CRITERIA.—
8	"(i) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of
9	Homeland Security shall establish specific
10	criteria for the preliminary review of an
11	application submitted under this section. If
12	an application does not meet such criteria,
13	the application may not receive further
14	consideration for a grant under this sec-
15	tion.
16	"(ii) ANNUAL REVIEW OF CRITERIA.—
17	Not less often than once each year, the
18	Secretary of Homeland Security, in con-
19	sultation with the Administrator, shall con-
20	vene a meeting of individuals who are
21	members of a fire service and are recog-
22	nized for expertise in firefighting or in
23	emergency medical services provided by
24	fire services, and who are not employees of
25	the Federal Government for the purpose of

1	reviewing and proposing changes to the
2	criteria established under clause (i).
3	"(B) Selection through review by
4	EXPERTS.—
5	"(i) REQUIREMENT FOR REVIEW
6	The Secretary of Homeland Security shall
7	award grants under this section based on
8	the review of applications for such grants
9	by a panel of fire service personnel ap-
10	pointed by a national organization recog-
11	nized for expertise in the operation and ad-
12	ministration of fire services.
13	"(ii) Role of the secretary.—The
14	Secretary of Homeland Security shall pro-
15	vide for the administration of the review
16	panel described in clause (i) and shall en-
17	sure that an individual appointed to such
18	panel is a recognized expert in firefighting,
19	medical services provided by fire services,
20	fire prevention, or research on firefighter
21	safety.".
22	SEC. 6. FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR FIREFIGHTER SAFETY
23	PROGRAMS.
24	(a) Authority.—Paragraph (1)(B) of section 33(b)
25	of the Federal Fire Prevention and Control Act of 1974

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1	(15 U.S.C. 2229(b)) is amended by inserting "and fire-
2	fighter safety" after "prevention".
3	(b) EXPANSION OF EXISTING PROGRAM.—
4	(1) FIREFIGHTER SAFETY ASSISTANCE.—Para-
5	graph (4) of such section is amended—
6	(A) in subparagraph (A)(ii), by striking
7	"organizations that are recognized" and all that
8	follows and inserting "organizations eligible
9	under subparagraph (B) for the purposes de-
10	scribed in subparagraph (C)."; and
11	(B) by striking subparagraph (B), and in-
12	serting the following new subparagraphs:
13	"(B) ELIGIBILITY FOR ASSISTANCE.—An
14	organization may be eligible for assistance
15	under subparagraph (A)(ii), if such organiza-
16	tion is a national, State, local, or community
17	organization that is not a fire service and that
18	is recognized for experience and expertise with
19	respect to programs and activities that pro-
20	mote—
21	"(i) fire prevention or fire safety; or
22	"(ii) the health and safety of fire-
23	fighting personnel.
24	"(C) USE OF FUNDS.—Assistance provided
25	under subparagraph (A)(ii) shall be used—

1	"(i) to carry out fire prevention pro-
2	grams; or
3	"(ii) to fund research to improve the
4	health and safety of firefighting personnel.
5	"(D) PRIORITY.—In selecting organiza-
6	tions described in subparagraph (B) to receive
7	assistance under this paragraph, the Secretary
8	of Homeland Security shall give priority—
9	"(i) to organizations that focus on
10	preventing injuries from fire to members of
11	groups at high risk of such injuries, with
12	an emphasis on children; and
13	"(ii) to organizations that focus on re-
14	searching methods to improve the health
15	and safety of firefighting personnel.
16	"(E) Allocation of funds.—Not less
17	than 66 percent of the total amount of funds
18	made available in a fiscal year to carry out this
19	paragraph shall be made available of the pro-
20	grams described in subparagraph (A)(ii).".
21	(2) Conforming Amendment.—The heading
22	of such paragraph is amended to read as follows:
23	"(4) FIRE PREVENTION AND FIREFIGHTER
24	SAFETY PROGRAMS.—".

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(c) AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS FOR FIRE PREVENTION
 AND FIREFIGHTER SAFETY PROGRAMS.—Paragraph
 (4)(A) of such section, as amended by subsection (b), is
 further amended in the matter preceding clause (i), by
 striking "5 percent" and inserting "6 percent".

6 SEC. 7. ASSISTANCE FOR APPLICATIONS.

Paragraph (5) of section 33(b) of the Federal Fire
Prevention and Control Act of 1974 (15 U.S.C. 2229(b)),
as amended by section 3(c), is further amended by adding
at the end the following new subparagraph:

"(D) ASSISTANCE TO PREPARE AN APPLICATION.—The Secretary of Homeland Security
shall provide assistance with the preparation of
applications for grants under this section.".

15 SEC. 8. REDUCED REQUIREMENTS FOR MATCHING FUNDS.

(a) AMOUNT REQUIRED.—Paragraph (6) of section
33(b) of the Federal Fire Prevention and Control Act of
1974 (15 U.S.C. 2229(b)) is amended by striking subparagraphs (A) and (B) and inserting the following:

20 "(A) IN GENERAL.—Subject to subpara21 graphs (B) and (C), the Secretary of Homeland
22 Security may provide assistance under this sub23 section only if the applicant for such assistance
24 agrees to match 20 percent of such assistance

1	for any fiscal year with an equal amount of
2	non-Federal funds.
3	"(B) REQUIREMENT FOR SMALL COMMU-
4	NITY ORGANIZATIONS.—In the case of an appli-
5	cant whose personnel—
6	"(i) serve jurisdictions of 50,000 or
7	fewer residents, the percent applied under
8	the matching requirement of subparagraph
9	(A) shall be 10 percent; or
10	"(ii) serve jurisdictions of 20,000 or
11	fewer residents, the percent applied under
12	the matching requirement of subparagraph
13	(A) shall be 5 percent.".
14	(b) EXCEPTION.—Such paragraph, as amended by
15	subsection (a), is further amended by adding at the end
16	the following new subparagraph:
17	"(C) EXCEPTION.—No matching funds
18	may be required under this subsection for as-
19	sistance provided under subparagraph (A)(ii) of
20	paragraph (4) to an organization described in
21	subparagraph (B) of such paragraph.".
22	(c) Special Rule for Requests for Automated
23	EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATOR DEVICES.—Section 33(b) of
24	such Act is further amended by adding at the end the fol-
25	lowing new paragraph:

1	"(13) Special rules for grants for auto-
2	MATED EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATOR DEVICES.—
3	"(A) LIMITATIONS.—The Secretary of
4	Homeland Security shall reduce the percentage
5	of non-Federal matching funds for a grant as
6	described in subparagraph (B) if—
7	"(i) the applicant is requesting grant
8	funds to obtain one or more automated ex-
9	ternal defibrillator devices, as authorized
10	by paragraph (3)(O);
11	"(ii) the award of such grant will re-
12	sult in the applicant possessing exactly one
13	such device for each first-due emergency
14	vehicle operated by the applicant;
15	"(iii) the applicant certifies to the
16	Secretary of Homeland Security that the
17	applicant possesses, at the time such appli-
18	cation is filed, a number of such devices
19	that is less than the number of first-due
20	emergency vehicles operated by the appli-
21	cant and that the applicant is capable of
22	storing, in a manner conducive to rapid
23	use, such devices on each such vehicle; and

1	"(iv) the applicant has not previously
2	received a grant under this subsection to
3	obtain such devices.
4	"(B) Matching requirements.—If an
5	applicant meets the criteria set out in clauses
6	(i), (ii), (iii), and (iv) of subparagraph (A), the
7	Secretary of Homeland Security shall reduce
8	the percentage of non-Federal matching funds
9	required by paragraph (6) by 2 percentage
10	points for all assistance requested in the appli-
11	cation submitted by such applicant.
12	"(C) FIRST-DUE DEFINED.—In this para-
13	graph, the term 'first-due' means the fire-
14	fighting and emergency medical services vehi-
15	cles that are utilized by a fire service for imme-
16	diate response to an emergency situation.".
17	SEC. 9. GRANT RECIPIENT LIMITATIONS.
18	(a) Limitations on Grant Amounts.—Subpara-
19	graph (A) of section 33(b)(10) of the Federal Fire Preven-
20	tion and Control Act of 1974 (15 U.S.C. 2229(b)(10)) is
21	amended to read as follows:
22	"(A) Limitations on grant amount.—
23	"(i) GENERAL LIMITATION.—Subject
24	to clause (ii), a recipient of assistance
25	under this section may not receive in a fis-

1 cal year an amount of such assistance that 2 exceeds the greater of \$2,250,000 or the 3 amount equal to 0.5 percent of the total 4 amount of funds appropriated for such as-5 sistance for such fiscal year. 6 "(ii) LIMITATIONS ON BASIS OF POPU-7 LATION.—Subject to clause (iii), a recipi-8 ent of assistance under this section that 9 serves a jurisdiction of less than 1,000,000 individuals may not receive more than 10 11 \$1,500,000 of such assistance for a fiscal 12 year, except that such a recipient that 13 serves a jurisdiction of less than 500,000 14 individuals may not receive more than 15 \$1,000,000 of such assistance during a fiscal year. 16 17 "(iii) WAIVER.—With respect to as-18 sistance provided in a fiscal year before fis-

18 sistance provided in a fiscal year before fis19 cal year 2007, the Secretary of Homeland
20 Security, in consultation with the Adminis21 trator, may waive the limitations set out in
22 clause (ii) if the Secretary determines that
23 a waiver is warranted by an extraordinary
24 need for assistance for fire suppression ac25 tivities by a jurisdiction, whether such need

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1	is caused by the likelihood of terrorist at-	
2	tack, natural disaster, destructive fires oc-	
3	curring over a large geographic area, or	
4	some other cause.".	
5	(b) Limitations on Grants for Volunteer	
6	EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES.—Such section, as	
7	amended by subsection (a), is further amended by adding	
8	at the end the following new subparagraph:	
9	"(C) Limitations on expenditures for	
10	VOLUNTEER EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES.—	
11	Not more than 3.5 percent of the funds appro-	
12	priated to provide grants under this section for	
13	a fiscal year may be awarded to volunteer emer-	
14	gency medical service organizations.".	
15	SEC. 10. OTHER CONSIDERATIONS.	
16	Section 33(b) of the Federal Fire Prevention and	
17	Control Act of 1974 (15 U.S.C. 2229(b)), as amended by	
18	section 8, is amended by adding at the end the following	
19	new paragraph:	
20	"(14) Other considerations.—In providing	
21	assistance under this section, the Secretary of	
22	Homeland Security shall—	
23	"(A) consider the extent to which the re-	
24	cipient of such assistance is able to enhance the	
25	daily operations of a fire service and to improve	

1	the protection of people and property from fire;
2	and
3	"(B) ensure that such assistance awarded
4	to a volunteer emergency medical service orga-
5	nization will not be used to provide emergency
6	medical services in a geographic area if such
7	services are adequately provided by a fire serv-
8	ice in such area.".
9	SEC. 11. REPORTS TO CONGRESS.
10	(a) Study and Report on Assistance to Fire-
11	FIGHTERS.—
12	(1) Study.—The Secretary, in conjunction with
13	the National Fire Protection Association, shall con-
14	duct a study—
15	(A) to assess the types of activities that
16	are carried out by fire services;
17	(B) to determine whether the level of Fed-
18	eral funding made available to fire services is
19	adequate;
20	(C) to assess categories of services, includ-
21	ing emergency medical services, that are not
22	adequately provided by fire services on either
23	the national or State level; and
24	(D) to measure the effect, if any, of the as-
25	sistance provided under section 33 of the Fed-

1 eral Fire Prevention and Control Act of 1974 2 (15 U.S.C. 2229) on the needs of fire services 3 identified in the report submitted to Congress 4 under section 1701(b) of the Floyd D. Spence 5 National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal 6 Year 2001 (as enacted into law by Public Law 7 106–398; 114 Stat. 1654A–363). 8 (2) REPORT.—Not later than 18 months after 9 the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary 10 shall submit to Congress a report on the findings of 11 the study described in paragraph (1). 12 (b) REPORT BY GAO.—Not later than 18 months 13 after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Comptroller General of the United States shall submit to Con-14 15 gress a report on— 16 (1) the administration of the assistance pro-17 vided under section 33 of the Federal Fire Preven-18 tion and Control Act of 1974 (15 U.S.C. 2229); and 19 (2) the success of the Secretary in admin-20 istering the Federal Emergency Management Agen-21 cy.

(c) REPORT ON WAIVER OF AMOUNT LIMITATIONS.—Not later than 18 months after the date of the
enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall submit to Congress a report on the instances, if any, of the use of the

waiver authority set out in section 33(b)(10)(A)(iii) of the
 Federal Fire Prevention and Control Act of 1974 (15
 U.S.C. 2229(b)(10)(A)(iii)), as added by section 9.

4 (d) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

5 (1) FIRE SERVICE.—The term "fire service"
6 has the meaning given that term in section 4 of the
7 Federal Fire Prevention and Control Act of 1974
8 (15 U.S.C. 2203).

9 (2) SECRETARY.—The term "Secretary" means
10 the Secretary of Homeland Security.

11 SEC. 12. TECHNICAL CORRECTIONS.

12 (a) REPEAL OF DUPLICATIVE DEFINITION.—Sub-13 section (d) of section 33 of the Federal Fire Prevention and Control Act of 1974 (15 U.S.C. 2229) is repealed. 14 15 (b) Redesignations Necessitated by Duplica-TIVE NUMBERING.—The sections 33 and 34 of the Fed-16 17 eral Fire Prevention and Control Act of 1974 (15 U.S.C. 18 2230 and 2231) that were added by sections 105 and 106 19 of Public Law 106–503 (114 Stat. 2301) are redesignated 20as sections 34 and 35, respectively.

21 SEC. 13. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

(a) FIREFIGHTER ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS.—Section
33(e) of the Federal Fire Prevention and Control Act of
1974 (15 U.S.C. 2229(e)) is amended by striking the first
sentence and inserting "There are authorized to be appro-

priated for the purposes of this section \$900,000,000 for
 fiscal year 2005, \$950,000,000 for fiscal year 2006, and
 \$1,000,000,000 for each of the fiscal years 2007 through
 2010.".

5 (b) STUDY ON ASSISTANCE TO FIREFIGHTERS.—
6 There are authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary
7 of Homeland Security \$300,000 for fiscal year 2005 to
8 carry out the requirements of section 11(a).

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
