To direct the Secretary of the Interior and the Secretary of Agriculture to jointly conduct a study of certain land adjacent to the Walnut Canyon National Monument in the State of Arizona.

Mr. MCCAIN introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources

## A BILL

- To direct the Secretary of the Interior and the Secretary of Agriculture to jointly conduct a study of certain land adjacent to the Walnut Canyon National Monument in the State of Arizona.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Walnut Canyon Study

5 Act of 2004".

### 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS AND PURPOSE.

7 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds that—

1	(1) the Coconino National Forest was estab-
2	lished in the State of Arizona on July 2, 1908;
3	(2) the Walnut Canyon National Monument in
4	the State of Arizona was originally designated as a
5	national monument by Presidential proclamation on
6	November 30, 1915, to protect Sinaguan cliff dwell-
7	ings;
8	(3) since the original designation, the Monu-
9	ment boundaries have been expanded to include
10	3,580 acres;
11	(4) National Forest System land and State
12	trust land in the study area contain significant cul-
13	tural and natural resources;
14	(5) the Coconino National Forest Land and Re-
15	sources Management Plan of 1987 identified Na-
16	tional Forest System land in the study area as land
17	for nondevelopment or disposal under the National
18	Forest Management Act of 1976 (16 U.S.C. 472a et
19	seq.);
20	(6) State trust land in the study area has been
21	temporarily removed from consideration for develop-
22	ment by State agencies with jurisdiction over the
23	State trust land;
24	(7) the communities in the vicinity of the land
25	in the study area support maintaining public uses of

1	the land surrounding the Monument while protecting
2	the resources of the land;
3	(8) several interest groups have proposed ex-
4	panding the Monument and designating the ex-
5	panded area as a national park or national preserve;
6	(9) the city of Flagstaff and Coconino County,
7	Arizona, have passed resolutions supporting further
8	review and study of, and the development of man-
9	agement options for, the study area; and
10	(10) to determine the appropriate management
11	of the adjacent land, interested parties have re-
12	quested a study to help identify management op-
13	tions.
14	(b) PURPOSES.—The purposes of this Act are—
15	(1) to authorize a study of the study area to
16	evaluate public uses and resource values; and
17	(2) to obtain recommendations for management
18	options for maintenance of the public uses and pro-
19	tection of resources of the study area.
20	SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS.
21	In this Act:
22	(1) MAP.—The term "map" means the map en-
23	titled "Walnut Canyon Proposed Study Area" and
24	dated July 17, 2003.

1	(9) MONTHUM The term "Monthemat"
	(2) MONUMENT.—The term "Monument"
2	means the Walnut Canyon National Monument in
3	the State of Arizona.
4	(3) Secretaries.—The term "Secretaries"
5	means the Secretary of the Interior and the Sec-
6	retary of Agriculture, acting jointly.
7	(4) Study area.—The term "study area"
8	means the area identified on the map as "Walnut
9	Canyon Proposed Study Area", consisting of 30,818
10	acres, of which—
11	(A) 24,987 acres is Federal land in
12	Coconino National Forest; and
13	(B) 2,037 acres is State land;
14	(C) 214 acres is private land; and
15	(D) 3,580 acres is the Monument.
16	SEC. 4. STUDY.
17	(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretaries shall conduct a
18	study of the study area.
19	(b) REQUIREMENTS.—The study shall evaluate—
20	(1) the significance of the resources of the
21	study area as the resources pertain to—
22	(A) the management objectives of the For-
23	est Service; and
24	(B) the management objectives of the Na-
25	tional Park Service;

1	(2) the opportunities for maintaining existing
2	public uses; and
3	(3) a range of options for managing and con-
4	serving resources by the National Park Service or
5	the Forest Service, or by both agencies acting joint-
6	ly, including the suitability and feasibility of—
7	(A) a boundary adjustment to the Monu-
8	ment;
9	(B) designation of the study area as a na-
10	tional park or preserve;
11	(C) maintaining the study area as man-
12	aged by the Forest Service; and
13	(D) any other designation or management
14	option that will accomplish both the protection
15	of resources and the maintenance of public use
16	and access for the study area.
17	(c) CONSULTATION.—In conducting the study, the
18	Secretaries may—
19	(1) contract with a third-party consultant with
20	experience in park and land use planning to prepare
21	a draft study; and
22	(2) collaborate with the persons identified in
23	subsection (d) in developing a scope of work for the
24	draft study under the guidance of the third-party
25	consultant.

(d) REVIEW; RECOMMENDATIONS.—The Secretaries,
 the Forest Supervisor of the Coconino National Forest,
 the Superintendent of the Flagstaff Area National Monu ments, the Flagstaff City Council, and the Coconino Coun ty Board of Supervisors shall—

6 (1) review the draft study prepared by the7 third-party consultant; and

8 (2) provide to the third-party consultant com9 ments on and recommendations for the draft study.
10 (e) REPORT.—Not later than 18 months after the
11 date of enactment of this Act, the Secretaries shall submit
12 to Congress a report that—

(1) describes the findings and conclusions of the
study conducted under this section, including the
recommendations of the persons identified in subsection (d); and

17 (2) makes a recommendation for the future18 management of the study area.

(f) EFFECT.—Nothing in this Act affects the man-agement of the land depicted on the map.

(g) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
are authorized to be appropriated such sums as are necessary to carry out this Act.
