## A BILL

To provide Capitol-flown flags to the families of law enforcement officers and firefighters killed in the line of duty.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Fallen Law Enforce-
- 5 ment Officers and Firefighters Flag Memorial Act of
- 6 2003".
- 7 SEC. 2. CAPITOL-FLOWN FLAGS FOR FAMILIES OF DE-
- 8 CEASED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS.
- 9 (a) AUTHORITY.—

- 1 (1) IN GENERAL.—The family of a deceased law
  2 enforcement officer may request, and the Attorney
  3 General shall provide to such family, a Capitol-flown
  4 flag, which shall be supplied to the Attorney General
  5 by the Architect of the Capitol. The Department of
  6 Justice shall pay the cost of such flag, including
  7 shipping, out of discretionary grant funds.
  8 (2) Effective Date.—Paragraph (1) shall
- 8 (2) EFFECTIVE DATE.—Paragraph (1) shall 9 take effect on the date on which the Attorney Gen-10 eral establishes the procedure required by subsection 11 (b).
- 12 (b) PROCEDURE.—Not later than 180 days after the
  13 date of enactment of this Act, the Attorney General shall
  14 establish a procedure (including any appropriate forms)
  15 by which the family of a deceased law enforcement officer
  16 may request, and provide sufficient information to deter-
- 17 mine such officer's eligibility for, a Capitol-flown flag.
  18 (c) Applicability.—This Act shall only apply to a
- 19 deceased law enforcement officer who died on or after the20 date of enactment of this Act.
- 21 (d) Definitions.—In this Act—
- 22 (1) the term "Capitol-flown flag" means a 23 United States flag flown over the United States 24 Capitol in honor of the deceased law enforcement of-25 ficer for whom such flag is requested; and

- 1 (2) the term "deceased law enforcement officer" 2 means a person who was charged with protecting 3 public safety, who was authorized to make arrests by 4 a Federal, State, Tribal, county, or local law en-5 forcement agency, and who died while acting in the 6 line of duty. SEC. 3. CAPITOL-FLOWN FLAGS FOR FAMILIES OF DE-
- 8 CEASED FIREFIGHTERS.
- 9 (a) AUTHORITY.—The family of a paid or volunteer 10 firefighter who dies in the line of duty may request, and
- the Director of the Federal Emergency Management
- Agency shall provide to such family, a capitol-flown flag,
- which shall be supplied to the Director by the Architect
- 14 of the Capitol. The Federal Emergency Management
- Agency shall pay the cost of such flag, including shipping,
- out of discretionary grant funds. 16
- 17 (b) Effective Date.—This section shall take effect
- 18 on the date on which the Attorney General establishes the
- procedure required by section 2(b).
