AN ACT

To provide Capitol-flown flags to the families of law enforcement officers and firefighters killed in the line of duty.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Fallen Law Enforce-
- 5 ment Officers and Firefighters Flag Memorial Act of
- 6 2003".

1	SEC. 2. CAPITOL-FLOWN FLAGS FOR FAMILIES OF DE-
2	CEASED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS AND
3	DECEASED FIREFIGHTERS.
4	(a) DEFINITIONS.—In this Act:
5	(1) Capitol-flown flag.—The term "Cap-
6	itol-flown flag'' means a United States flag flown
7	over the United States Capitol and provided under
8	this Act to honor the deceased law enforcement offi-
9	cer or firefighter for whom such flag is requested.
10	(2) Deceased firefighter.—The term "de-
11	ceased firefighter" means a person who—
12	(A) performs firefighting duties on a paid
13	or voluntary basis; and
14	(B) dies in the line of duty as a firefighter.
15	(3) Deceased law enforcement officer.—
16	The term "deceased law enforcement officer" means
17	a person who was charged with protecting public
18	safety, who was authorized to make arrests by a
19	Federal, State, Tribal, county, or local law enforce-
20	ment agency, and who died while acting in the line
21	of duty.
22	(4) Member of Congress.—The term "Mem-
23	ber of Congress" means a Senator, a Representative
24	in Congress, or a Delegate to Congress.
25	(b) Member Offices.—

1	(1) In general.—The family of a deceased law
2	enforcement officer or a deceased firefighter may re-
3	quest that a Member of Congress provide to that
4	family a Capitol-flown flag.
5	(2) Expense.—The costs associated with pro-
6	viding a flag under this subsection may be paid from
7	official funds.
8	(c) APPLICABILITY.—This Act shall only apply to a
9	deceased law enforcement officer or a deceased firefighter
10	who died on or after the date of enactment of this Act.
