A BILL

- To authorize the Secretary of the Interior, in cooperation with the University of New Mexico, to construct and occupy a portion of the Hibben Center for Archaeological Research at the University of New Mexico, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Hibben Center for Ar-

5 chaeological Research Act of 2003".

6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

7 Congress finds that—

1	(1) when the Chaco Culture National Historical
2	Park was established in 1907 as the Chaco Canyon
3	National Monument, the University of New Mexico
4	owned a significant portion of the land located with-
5	in the boundaries of the Park;
6	(2) during the period from the 1920's to 1947,
7	the University of New Mexico conducted archae-
8	ological research in the Chaco Culture National His-
9	torical Park;
10	(3) in 1949, the University of New Mexico—
11	(A) conveyed to the United States all
12	right, title, and interest of the University in and
13	to the land in the Park; and
14	(B) entered into a memorandum of agree-
15	ment with the National Park Service estab-
16	lishing a research partnership with the Park;
17	(4) since 1971, the Chaco Culture National
18	Historical Park, through memoranda of under-
19	standing and cooperative agreements with the Uni-
20	versity of New Mexico, has maintained a research
21	museum collection and archive at the University;
22	(5) both the Park and the University have
23	large, significant archaeological research collections
24	stored at the University in multiple, inadequate, in-
25	accessible, and cramped repositories; and

1 (6) insufficient storage at the University makes 2 research on and management, preservation, and con-3 servation of the archaeological research collections difficult. 4 5 SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS. 6 In this Act: (1) HIBBEN CENTER.—The term "Hibben Cen-7 ter" means the Hibben Center for Archaeological 8 9 Research to be constructed at the University under 10 section 4(a). (2) PARK.—The term "Park" means the Chaco 11 12 Culture National Historical Park in the State of 13 New Mexico. 14 (3) SECRETARY.—The term "Secretary" means 15 the Secretary of the Interior. (4) TENANT IMPROVEMENT.—The term "tenant 16 17 improvement" includes-18 (A) finishing the interior portion of the 19 Hibben Center leased by the National Park 20 Service under section 4(c)(1); and 21 (B) installing in that portion of the Hibben 22 Center— 23 (i) permanent fixtures; and 24 (ii) portable storage units and other 25 removable objects.

UNIVERSITY.—The 1 (5)term "University" 2 means the University of New Mexico. 3 SEC. 4. HIBBEN CENTER FOR ARCHAEOLOGICAL RE-4 SEARCH. 5 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—The Secretary may, in cooperation with the University, construct and occupy a por-6 7 tion of the Hibben Center for Archaeological Research at 8 the University. 9 (b) GRANTS.— 10 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary may provide 11 to the University a grant to pay the Federal share 12 of the construction and related costs for the Hibben 13 Center under paragraph (2). 14 (2) FEDERAL SHARE.—The Federal share of 15 the construction and related costs for the Hibben 16 Center shall be 37 percent. 17 LIMITATION.—Amounts provided under (3)18 paragraph (1) shall not be used to pay any costs to 19 design, construct, and furnish the tenant improve-20 ments under subsection (c)(2). 21 (c) LEASE.— 22 (1) IN GENERAL.—Before funds made available 23 under section 5 may be expended for construction 24 costs under subsection (b)(1) or for the costs for 25 tenant improvements under paragraph (2), the Uni-

versity shall offer to enter into a long-term lease
with the United States that—
(A) provides to the National Park Service
space in the Hibben Center for storage, re-
search, and offices; and
(B) is acceptable to the Secretary.
(2) TENANT IMPROVEMENTS.—The Secretary
may design, construct, and furnish tenant improve-
ments for, and pay any moving costs relating to, the
portion of the Hibben Center leased to the National
Park Service under paragraph (1).
(d) COOPERATIVE AGREEMENTS.—To encourage col-
laborative management of the Chacoan archaeological ob-
jects associated with northwestern New Mexico, the Sec-
retary may enter into cooperative agreements with the
University, other units of the National Park System, other
Federal agencies, and Indian tribes for—
(1) the curation of and conduct of research on
artifacts in the museum collection described in sec-
tion $2(4)$; and
(2) the development, use, management, and op-
eration of the portion of the Hibben Center leased
to the National Park Service under subsection
(c)(1).

1 SEC. 5. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—There are authorized to be appro-3 priated—

4 (1) to pay the Federal share of the construction
5 costs under section 4(b), \$1,574,000; and
6 (2) to pay the costs of carrying out section
7 4(c)(2), \$2,198,000.

8 (b) AVAILABILITY.—Amounts made available under9 subsection (a) shall remain available until expended.

10 (c) REVERSION.—If the lease described in section 11 4(c)(1) is not executed by the date that is 2 years after 12 the date of enactment of this Act, any amounts made 13 available under subsection (a) shall revert to the Treasury 14 of the United States.
