A BILL

To require the Secretary of the Treasury to mint coins in commemoration of the 230th Anniversary of the United States Marine Corps, and to support construction of the Marine Corps Heritage Center.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Marine Corps 230th
- 5 Anniversary Commemorative Coin Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 7 Congress finds that—

- 1 (1) November 10, 2005, marks the 230th anni-2 versary of the United States Marine Corps;
 - (2) the United States Marine Corps has, over the course of its illustrious 230-year history, fought gallantly in defense of the United States;
 - (3) the United States Marine Corps has, over the course of its storied history, established itself as the Nation's military leader in amphibious warfare, and will continue in that role as the United States faces the challenges of the 21st Century;
 - (4) the United States Marine Corps continues to exemplify the warrior ethos that has made it a fighting force of international repute;
 - (5) all Americans should commemorate the legacy of the United States Marine Corps so that the values embodied in the "Corps" are recognized for the significant contribution they have made in protecting the United States against its enemies;
 - (6) in 2001, Congress authorized the construction of the Marine Corps Heritage Center, the purpose of which is to provide a multipurpose facility to be used for historical displays for the public viewing, curation, and storage of artifacts, research facilities, classrooms, offices, and associated activities, consistent with the mission of the Marine Corps;

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1	(7) the Marine Corps Heritage Center is sched-
2	uled to open on November 10, 2005;
3	(8) the United States should pay tribute to the
4	230th anniversary of the United States Marine
5	Corps by minting and issuing a commemorative sil-
6	ver dollar coin; and
7	(9) the surcharge proceeds from the sale of a
8	commemorative coin, which would have no net costs
9	to the taxpayers, would raise valuable funding for
10	the construction of the Marine Corps Heritage Cen-
11	ter.

1 SEC. 4. SOURCES OF BULLION.

2	The Secretary shall obtain silver for minting coins
3	under this Act from all available sources, including stock-
4	piles established under the Strategic and Critical Mate-
5	rials Stock Piling Act.
6	SEC. 5. DESIGN OF COINS.
7	(a) Design Requirements.—
8	(1) In general.—The design of the coins
9	minted under this Act shall be emblematic of the
10	warrior ethos of the United States Marine Corps.
11	(2) Designation and inscriptions.—On
12	each coin minted under this Act, there shall be—
13	(A) a designation of the value of the coin;
14	(B) an inscription of the year "2005"; and
15	(C) inscriptions of the words "Liberty",
16	"In God We Trust", "United States of Amer-
17	ica", and "E Pluribus Unum".
18	(b) Selection.—The design for the coins minted
19	under this Act shall be—
20	(1) selected by the Secretary, after consultation
21	with the Marine Corps Historical Division and the
22	Commission of Fine Arts; and
23	(2) reviewed by the Citizens Commemorative
24	Coin Advisory Committee.

1 SEC. 6. ISSUANCE OF COINS.

- 2 (a) QUALITY OF COINS.—Coins minted under this
- 3 Act shall be issued in uncirculated and proof qualities.
- 4 (b) MINT FACILITY.—Only 1 facility of the United
- 5 States Mint may be used to strike any particular quality
- 6 of the coins minted under this Act.
- 7 (c) Period for Issuance.—The Secretary may
- 8 issue coins minted under this Act only during the 1-year
- 9 period beginning on January 1, 2005.

10 SEC. 7. SALE OF COINS.

- 11 (a) Sale Price.—The coins issued under this Act
- 12 shall be sold by the Secretary at a price equal to the sum
- 13 of—
- 14 (1) the face value of the coins;
- 15 (2) the surcharge provided in subsection (b)
- with respect to such coins; and
- 17 (3) the cost of designing and issuing the coins
- 18 (including labor, materials, dies, use of machinery,
- overhead expenses, marketing, and shipping).
- 20 (b) Surcharges.—All sales of coins issued under
- 21 this Act shall include a surcharge of \$10 per coin.
- 22 (c) Bulk Sales.—The Secretary shall make bulk
- 23 sales of coins issued under this Act at a reasonable dis-
- 24 count.
- 25 (d) Prepaid Orders.—

- 1 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall accept
- 2 prepaid orders for coins minted under this Act be-
- fore the issuance of such coins.
- 4 (2) DISCOUNT.—Sale prices with respect to pre-
- 5 paid orders under paragraph (1) should be at a rea-
- 6 sonable discount.

7 SEC. 8. DISTRIBUTION OF SURCHARGES.

- 8 (a) DISTRIBUTION.—Subject to section 5134(f) of
- 9 title 31, United States Code, all surcharges received by
- 10 the Secretary from the sale of coins issued under this Act
- 11 shall be promptly paid by the Secretary to the Marine
- 12 Corps Heritage Foundation for the purposes of construc-
- 13 tion of the Marine Corps Heritage Center, as authorized
- 14 by section 1 of Public Law 106-398 (114 Stat. 1654).
- 15 (b) Audit.—The Marine Corps Heritage Foundation
- 16 shall be subject to the audit requirements of section
- 17 5134(f)(2) of title 31, United States Code, with regard
- 18 to the amounts received under subsection (a).

19 SEC. 9. FINANCIAL ASSURANCES.

- 20 (a) No Net Cost to the Government.—The Sec-
- 21 retary shall take such actions as may be necessary to en-
- 22 sure that minting and issuing coins under this Act will
- 23 not result in any net cost to the United States Govern-
- 24 ment.

1	(b) PAYMENT FOR COINS.—A coin shall not be issued
2	under this Act unless the Secretary has received—
3	(1) full payment for the coin;
4	(2) security satisfactory to the Secretary to in-
5	demnify the United States for full payment; or
6	(3) a guarantee of full payment satisfactory to
7	the Secretary from a depository institution, the de-
8	posits of which are insured by the Federal Deposit
9	Insurance Corporation or the National Credit Union
10	Administration.

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
