To prohibit Members of the Senate and other persons from removing art and historic objects from the Senate wing of the Capitol and Senate office buildings for personal use.

- 1 Resolved, That (a) a Member of the Senate or any
- 2 other person may not remove a work of art, historical ob-
- 3 ject, or an exhibit from the Senate wing of the Capitol
- 4 or any Senate office building for personal use.

- 1 (b) For purposes of this resolution, the term "work
- 2 of art, historical object, or an exhibit" means an item, in-
- 3 cluding furniture, identified on the list (and any supple-
- 4 ment to the list) required by section 4 of Senate Resolu-
- 5 tion 382, 90th Congress, as enacted into law by section
- 6 901(a) of Public Law 100–696 (2 U.S.C. 2104).
- 7 (c) For purposes of this resolution, the Senate Com-
- 8 mission on Art shall update the list required by section
- 9 4 of Senate Resolution 382, 90th Congress (2 U.S.C.
- 10 2104) every 6 months after the date of adoption of this
- 11 resolution and shall provide a copy of the updated list to
- 12 the Committee on Rules and Administration.
