## RESOLUTION

To prohibit Members of the Senate and other persons from removing art and historic objects from the Senate wing of the Capitol and Senate office buildings for personal use.

1       *Resolved*, That (a) a Member of the Senate or any  
2 other person may not remove a work of art, historical ob-  
3 ject, or an exhibit from the Senate wing of the Capitol  
4 or any Senate office building for personal use.

5       (b) For purposes of this resolution, the term “work  
6 of art, historical object, or an exhibit” means an item, in-  
7 cluding furniture, identified on the list (and any supple-  
8 ment to the list) required by section 4 of Senate Resolu-

1 tion 382, 90th Congress, as enacted into law by section  
2 901(a) of Public Law 100–696 (2 U.S.C. 2104).

3 (c) For purposes of this resolution, the Senate Com-  
4 mission on Art shall update the list required by section  
5 4 of Senate Resolution 382, 90th Congress (2 U.S.C.  
6 2104) every 6 months after the date of adoption of this  
7 resolution and shall provide a copy of the updated list to  
8 the Committee on Rules and Administration.
