RESOLUTION

To prohibit Members of the Senate and other persons from removing art and historic objects from the Senate wing of the Capitol and Senate office buildings for personal use.

Resolved, That (a) a Member of the Senate or any
 other person may not remove a work of art, historical ob ject, or an exhibit from the Senate wing of the Capitol
 or any Senate office building for personal use.

5 (b) For purposes of this resolution, the term "work 6 of art, historical object, or an exhibit" means an item, in-7 cluding furniture, identified on the list (and any supple-8 ment to the list) required by section 4 of Senate Resolution 382, 90th Congress, as enacted into law by section
 901(a) of Public Law 100-696 (2 U.S.C. 2104).

3 (c) For purposes of this resolution, the Senate Com4 mission on Art shall update the list required by section
5 4 of Senate Resolution 382, 90th Congress (2 U.S.C.
6 2104) every 6 months after the date of adoption of this
7 resolution and shall provide a copy of the updated list to
8 the Committee on Rules and Administration.
