Mr. FRIST (for himself and Mr. DASCHLE) submitted the following resolution;
which was considered and agreed to

RESOLUTION

To authorize the production of records by the Committee
on Commerce, Science, and Transportation.

Whereas the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation has been conducting an inquiry into the potential use of banned performance-enhancing drugs by U.S. Olympic sport athletes;

Whereas the Committee has received requests from both the U.S. Olympic committee and the U.S. Anti-Doping Agency that the latter gain access to records of the Committee's inquiry;

Whereas, by the privileges of the Senate of the United States and rule XI of the Standing Rules of the Senate, no evidence under the control or in the possession of the Senate can, by administrative or judicial process, be taken

from such control or possession but by permission of the Senate; and

Whereas, when it appears that evidence under the control or in the possession of the Senate is needed for the promotion of justice, the Senate will take such action as will promote the ends of justice consistent with the privileges of the Senate: Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved*, That the Chairman and Ranking Minority
2 Member of the Committee on Commerce, Science, and
3 Transportation, acting jointly, are authorized to provide
4 to the U.S. Anti-Doping Agency the documents subpoenaed
5 by the Committee regarding the potential use of
6 banned performance-enhancing drugs by U.S. Olympic
7 sport athletes.
