Mr. SHUSTER (for himself and Ms. NORTON) submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing the use of the Capitol Grounds for the District
of Columbia Special Olympics Law Enforcement Torch Run.

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring),*

3 **SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION OF USE OF CAPITOL**
4 **GROUNDS FOR D.C. SPECIAL OLYMPICS LAW**
5 **ENFORCEMENT TORCH RUN.**

6 On June 9, 2006, or on such other date as the Speak-
7 er of the House of Representatives and the Committee on
8 Rules and Administration of the Senate may jointly des-
9 ignate, the 2006 District of Columbia Special Olympics
10 Law Enforcement Torch Run (in this resolution referred

1 to as the “event”) may be run through the Capitol
2 Grounds as part of the journey of the Special Olympics
3 torch to the District of Columbia Special Olympics sum-
4 mer games.

5 **SEC. 2. RESPONSIBILITY OF CAPITOL POLICE BOARD.**

6 The Capitol Police Board shall take such actions as
7 may be necessary to carry out the event.

8 **SEC. 3. CONDITIONS RELATING TO PHYSICAL PREPARA-**
9 **TIONS.**

10 The Architect of the Capitol may prescribe conditions
11 for physical preparations for the event.

12 **SEC. 4. ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS.**

13 The Capitol Police Board shall provide for enforce-
14 ment of the restrictions contained in section 5104(c) of
15 title 40, United States Code, concerning sales, advertise-
16 ments, displays, and solicitations on the Capitol Grounds,
17 as well as other restrictions applicable to the Capitol
18 Grounds, in connection with the event.

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
