AN ACT

- To amend the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act to designate portions of the Musconetcong River in the State of New Jersey as a component of the National Wild and Scenic Rivers System, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Musconetcong Wild3 and Scenic Rivers Act".

4 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

5 Congress finds the following:

6 (1) The Secretary of the Interior, in coopera-7 tion and consultation with appropriate Federal, 8 State, regional, and local agencies, is conducting a 9 study of the eligibility and suitability of the 10 Musconetcong River in the State of New Jersey for 11 inclusion in the Wild and Scenic Rivers System.

12 (2) The Musconetcong Wild and Scenic River 13 Study Task Force has prepared, with assistance 14 from the National Park Service, a river management 15 plan for the study area entitled "Musconetcong 16 River Management Plan" and dated April 2003, 17 which establishes goals and actions that will ensure 18 long-term protection of the outstanding values of the 19 river and compatible management of land and water 20 resources associated with the river.

(3) Thirteen municipalities and three counties
along segments of the Musconetcong River eligible
for designation have passed resolutions supporting
the Musconetcong River Management Plan, agreeing
to take action to implement the goals of the plan,
and endorsing designation of the river.

SEC. 3. DESIGNATION OF PORTIONS OF MUSCONETCONG RIVER, NEW JERSEY, AS SCENIC AND REC REATIONAL RIVERS.

4 (a) DESIGNATION.—Section 3(a) of the Wild and
5 Scenic Rivers Act (16 U.S.C. 1274(a)) is amended by add6 ing at the end the following new paragraph:

7 "(167) MUSCONETCONG RIVER, NEW JERSEY.—(A)
8 The 24.2 miles of river segments in New Jersey, to be
9 administered by the Secretary of the Interior, consisting
10 of—

"(i) the segment from Saxton Falls to the
Route 46 bridge (approximately 3.5 miles), as a scenic river; and

14 "(ii) the segment from the Kings Highway
15 bridge to the railroad tunnels at Musconetcong
16 Gorge (approximately 20.7 miles), as a recreational
17 river.

18 "(B) Notwithstanding section 10(c), the river seg19 ments referred to in subparagraph (A) shall not be admin20 istered as part of the National Park System.".

21 (b) MANAGEMENT OF SEGMENTS.—

(1) COMPLIANCE WITH MANAGEMENT PLAN.—
The Secretary of the Interior shall manage the segments of the Musconetcong River, New Jersey, designated as a scenic river or recreational river by the
amendment made by subsection (a) in accordance
HR 1307 RFS

1	with the river management plan entitled
2	"Musconetcong River Management Plan" and dated
3	April 2002, prepared by the Musconetcong River
4	Management Committee, the National Park Service,
5	the Heritage Conservancy, and the Musconetcong
6	Watershed Association, which establishes goals and
7	actions that will ensure long-term protection of the
8	outstanding values of the river segments and com-
9	patible management of land and water resources as-
10	sociated with the river segments.
11	(2) COOPERATION.—The Secretary shall man-
12	age the river segments in cooperation with appro-
13	priate Federal, State, regional, and local agencies,
14	including—
15	(A) the Musconetcong River Management
16	Committee;
17	(B) the Musconetcong Watershed Associa-
18	tion;
19	(C) the Heritage Conservancy;
20	(D) the National Park Service; and
21	(E) the New Jersey Department of Envi-
22	ronmental Protection.
23	(c) Satisfaction of Requirements for Plan.—
24	The management plan shall be considered to satisfy the
25	requirements for a comprehensive management plan for

the river segments under subsection 3(d) of the Wild and
 Scenic Rivers Act (16 U.S.C. 1274(d)).

3 (d) FEDERAL ROLE.—

4 (1)RESTRICTIONS ON WATER RESOURCE 5 **PROJECTS.**—In determining under section 7(a) of 6 the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act (16 U.S.C. 1278(a)) 7 whether a proposed water resources project would 8 have a direct and adverse effect on the values for 9 which a river segment is designated as part of the 10 Wild and Scenic Rivers System, the Secretary shall 11 consider the extent to which the project is consistent 12 with the management plan.

(2) COOPERATIVE AGREEMENTS.—Any cooperative agreements entered into under section 10(e) of
the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act (16 U.S.C. 1281(e))
relating to a river segment—

17 (A) shall be consistent with the manage-18 ment plan; and

(B) may include provisions for financial or
other assistance from the United States to facilitate the long-term protection, conservation,
and enhancement of the river segment.

23 (3) SUPPORT FOR IMPLEMENTATION.—The
24 Secretary may provide technical assistance, staff

1	support, and funding to assist in the implementation
2	of the management plan.
3	(e) Land Management.—
4	(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary may provide
5	planning, financial, and technical assistance to local
6	municipalities and non-profit organizations to assist
7	in the implementation of actions to protect the nat-
8	ural and historic resources of the river segments.
9	(2) PLAN REQUIREMENTS.—After adoption of
10	recommendations made in section IV of the manage-
11	ment plan, the zoning ordinances of the municipali-
12	ties bordering the segments shall be considered to
13	satisfy the standards and requirements under sec-
14	tion $6(c)$ of the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act (16
15	U.S.C. 1277(c)).
16	(f) DESIGNATION OF ADDITIONAL RIVER SEG-
17	MENT.—
18	(1) FINDING.—Congress finds that the

Musconetcong River segment "C", as described in the management plan, is suitable for designation as a recreational river pursuant to this subsection if the Secretary determines that there is adequate local support for the designation.

24 (2) DESIGNATION AND ADMINISTRATION.—If
25 the Secretary determines that there is adequate local

1	support for designating the additional river segment
2	as a recreational river—
3	(A) the Secretary shall publish in the Fed-
4	eral Register a notice of the designation of the
5	segment;
6	(B) the segment shall thereby be des-
7	ignated as a recreational river in accordance
8	with the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act (16 U.S.C.
9	1271 et seq.); and
10	(C) the Secretary shall administer the ad-
11	ditional river segment as a recreational river.
12	(3) CRITERIA FOR LOCAL SUPPORT.—In deter-
13	mining whether there is adequate local support for
14	the designation of the additional river segment, the
15	Secretary shall consider, among other things, the
16	preferences of local governments expressed in resolu-
17	tions concerning designation of the segment.
18	(g) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
19	are authorized to be appropriated such funds as are nec-
20	essary to carry out this section, including the amendment
21	to the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act made by this section.
22	(h) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:
23	(1) Additional river segment.—The term
24	"additional river segment" means Musconetcong
25	River segment "C", as described in the management

plan, from Hughesville Mill to the Delaware River
Confluence (approximately 4.3 miles).
(2) MANAGEMENT PLAN.—The term "manage-
ment plan" means the river management plan enti-
tled "Musconetcong River Management Plan" and
dated April 2002.
(3) River segments.—The term "river seg-
ments" means the segments of the Musconetcong
River, New Jersey, designated as a scenic river or
recreational river by the amendment made by sub-
section (a) in accordance with the management plan.
(4) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
the Secretary of the Interior.
