A BILL

To amend title 10, United States Code, to provide leave for members of the Armed Forces in connection with adoptions of children, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. ADOPTION LEAVE FOR MEMBERS OF THE 4 ARMED FORCES ADOPTING CHILDREN.

5 (a) AUTHORITY.—Section 701 of title 10, United
6 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol7 lowing new subsection:

8 "(i)(1) Under regulations prescribed by the Secretary9 of Defense, a member of the armed forces adopting a child

1 in a qualifying child adoption is entitled to 21 days of2 leave to be used in connection with the adoption.

3 "(2) For the purpose of this subsection, an adoption 4 of a child by a member is a qualifying child adoption if 5 the member is eligible for reimbursement of qualified 6 adoption expenses for such adoption under section 1052 7 of this title.

8 "(3) In the event that two members of the armed 9 forces who are spouses of each other adopt a child in a 10 qualifying child adoption, only one such member shall be 11 entitled to leave under this subsection. Such members 12 shall elect which such member shall be entitled to such 13 leave.

14 "(4) Leave under paragraph (1) is in addition to15 other leave provided under other provisions of this sec-16 tion.".

(b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—Subsection (i) of section 701
of title 10, United States Code (as added by subsection
(a)), shall take effect on October 1, 2005.
