- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Student Athlete Pro-
- 5 tection Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. PROHIBITION.
- 7 Section 3704 of title 28, United States Code, is
- 8 amended—

1	(1) in subsection (a), by striking "Section" and
2	inserting "Except as provided in subsection (c), sec-
3	tion"; and
4	(2) by adding at the end the following:
5	"(c)(1) Section 3702 shall apply to a lottery, sweep-
6	stakes or other betting, gambling, or wagering scheme
7	based, directly or indirectly, on—
8	"(A)(i) one or more competitive games in which
9	high school or college athletes participate; or
10	"(ii) one or more performances of high school
11	or college athletes in competitive games; or
12	"(B) one or more competitive games at the
13	Summer or Winter Olympics.
14	"(2) In this section—
15	"(A) the term 'high school' has the meaning
16	given the term 'secondary school' in section 14102
17	of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of
18	1965; and
19	"(B) the term 'college' has the meaning given
20	the term 'institution of higher education' in section
21	101 of the Higher Education Act of 1965.".

1 SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.

- 2 The amendments made by section 2 shall take effect
- 3 on the date that is 30 days after the date of the enactment
