A BILL

To return general aviation to Ronald Reagan Washington National Airport.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 2 This Act may be cited as the "Return of General

- 5 SEC. 2. AIR CHARTER AND GENERAL AVIATION OPER-
- 6 ATIONS AT RONALD REAGAN WASHINGTON
- 7 NATIONAL AIRPORT.
- 8 Notwithstanding any law, regulation, or agency policy
- 9 or directive that has the effect of generally prohibiting
- 10 general aviation aircraft from landing at Ronald Reagan
- 11 Washington National Airport, not later than 180 days
- 12 after the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of
- 13 Transportation, acting through the Federal Aviation Ad-
- 14 ministration, in consultation with the Secretary of Home-
- 15 land Security, shall permit the resumption of non-
- 16 scheduled, commercial air carrier air charter and general
- 17 aviation operations at Ronald Reagan Washington Na-
- 18 tional Airport.

1	SEC. 2. AIR CHARTER AND GENERAL AVIATION OPER-
2	ATIONS AT RONALD REAGAN WASHINGTON
3	NATIONAL AIRPORT.
4	Notwithstanding any law, regulation, or agency policy
5	or directive that has the effect of generally prohibiting gen-
6	eral aviation aircraft from landing at Ronald Reagan
7	Washington National Airport, not later than 60 days after
8	the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Transpor-
9	tation, acting through the Federal Aviation Administra-
10	tion, in consultation with the Secretary of Homeland Secu-
11	rity, shall permit the resumption of nonscheduled, commer-
12	cial air carrier air charter and general aviation operations
13	at Ronald Reagan Washington National Airport. In com-
14	plying with the requirements of this section, the Secretary
15	of Transportation shall consult with the general aviation
16	industry. Nothing in this section shall be construed to limit
17	or otherwise affect section 823 of the Vision 100—Century
18	of Aviation Reauthorization Act (49 U.S.C. 41718 note; 117
19	Stat. 2595).

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
