Mr. ANDREWS introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Appropriations

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## A BILL

To make supplemental appropriations for fiscal year 2005 to ensure the inclusion of commonly used pesticides in State source water assessment programs, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS TO ENSURE**  
2 **INCLUSION OF COMMONLY USED PESTICIDES**  
3 **IN STATE SOURCE WATER ASSESSMENT PRO-**  
4 **GRAMS.**

5 The following sums are appropriated, out of any  
6 money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to pro-  
7 vide supplemental appropriations for fiscal year 2005:

8 ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY  
9 STATE AND TRIBAL ASSISTANCE GRANTS

10 For an additional amount for “State and Tribal As-  
11 sistance Grants”, for grants for the Drinking Water State  
12 Revolving Funds under section 1452 of the Safe Drinking  
13 Water Act (42 U.S.C. 300j–12) for State expenses of for-  
14 mulating source water assessment programs under section  
15 1453 of such Act, \$85,000,000, to remain available until  
16 expended.

17 Hereafter, source water assessment programs under  
18 section 1453 of such Act shall include (1) the assessment  
19 of the pesticides chlorothalonil, pendimethalin, paraquat,  
20 cyanazine, bensulide, chlorpyrifos, diazinon, metalaxyl,  
21 and mecoprop; (2) the assessment of surface water  
22 sources; (3) the assessment of residential drinking wells;  
23 and (4) the assessment of contaminated soil.

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
