A BILL

To designate the John L. Burton Trail in the Headwaters
Forest Reserve, California.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. DESIGNATION OF JOHN L. BURTON TRAIL.**

4 (a) SHORT TITLE.—This Act may be cited as the
5 “John L. Burton Trail Act”.

1 (b) DESIGNATION OF JOHN L. BURTON TRAIL.—Any
2 trail authorized by the final management plan under sec-
3 tion 501(i) of Public Law 105–33 (111 Stat. 1613) for
4 Headwaters Forest Reserve, California, that is con-
5 structed to provide access to the southern end of the
6 Headwaters Grove near the existing Salmon Trailhead
7 shall be known as the “John L. Burton Trail”.
