To amend the National Trails System Act to designate the Chisholm Trail and Great Western Trail historic cattledrive trails for study and for potential addition to the National Trails System, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Chisholm and Great
- 5 Western Cattle Trails Act of 2005".

1	SEC. 2. DESIGNATION OF THE CHISHOLM TRAIL FOR
2	STUDY AND FOR POTENTIAL ADDITION TO
3	THE NATIONAL TRAILS SYSTEM.
4	Section 5(e) of the National Trails System Act (16
5	U.S.C. 1244(c)) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
6	lowing new paragraph:
7	"() THE CHISHOLM TRAIL NATIONAL HISTORIC
8	TRAIL (ALSO KNOWN AS THE ABILENE TRAIL).—The
9	Secretary of the Interior shall undertake a study of the
10	routes commonly known as the Chisholm Trail, from the
11	vicinity of Brownsville, Texas; northward through the vi-
12	cinity of San Antonio, Texas and segments from the vicin-
13	ity of Cuero, Texas; to Ft. Worth, Texas; Duncan, Okla-
14	homa, and alternate segments used through Oklahoma, to
15	Enid, Oklahoma; Caldwell, Kansas; Wichita, Kansas; Abi-
16	lene, Kansas; and the segments running to alternative
17	Kansas destinations that were commonly used, to deter-
18	mine the feasibility and suitability of designation of one
19	or more of the routes as components of the Chisholm Trail
20	National Historie Trail.".
21	SEC. 3. DESIGNATION OF THE GREAT WESTERN TRAIL FOR
22	STUDY AND FOR POTENTIAL ADDITION TO
23	THE NATIONAL TRAILS SYSTEM.
24	Section 5(c) of the National Trails System Act (16
25	U.S.C. 12441(c)) is amended by adding at the end the
26	following new paragraph:

- 1 "() The Great Western Trail National
- 2 HISTORIC TRAIL (ALSO KNOWN AS THE DODGE CITY
- 3 Trail).—The Secretary of the Interior shall undertake a
- 4 study of the routes commonly known as the Great Western
- 5 Trail, from the vicinity of San Antonio, Texas, north-by-
- 6 northwest through the vicinities of Kerrville and Menard,
- 7 Texas; north-by-northeast through the vicinities of Cole-
- 8 man and Albany, Texas; north through the vicinity of
- 9 Vernon, Texas, to Doan's Crossing, Texas; northward
- 10 through Oklahoma through or near the vicinities of Altus,
- 11 Lone Wolf, Canute, Vici, May; and north through Kansas
- 12 to Dodge City, to determine the feasibility and suitability
- 13 of designation of one or more of the routes as components
- 14 of the Great Western Trail National Historic Trail.".

15 SEC. 4. REPORT TO CONGRESS.

- 16 (a) STUDY REQUIREMENTS AND OBJECTIVES.—The
- 17 study requirements and objectives specified in section 5(b)
- 18 of the National Trails System Act (16 U.S.C. 1244(b))
- 19 shall apply to studies required by this Act.
- 20 (b) Completion and Submission of Study.—Not
- 21 later than three complete fiscal years after the date of the
- 22 enactment of this section, the Secretary of the Interior
- 23 shall complete and submit to Congress the studies re-
- 24 quired. In the case of a study added to this section after
- 25 that date, the study shall be completed and submitted to

- 1 Congress not later than three complete fiscal years after
- 2 the date of the enactment of the law adding the study to
- 3 this section.
- 4 SEC. 5. LAND ACQUISITION.
- 5 No lands or interests therein outside the exterior
- 6 boundaries of any federally administered area may be ac-
- 7 quired by the Federal Government for the Chisholm Trail
- 8 or Great Western Trail except with the consent of the
- 9 owner thereof.
